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

Stella Hiatt Kane (Choreographer) has been a member of the Otterbein faculty since 1989 and Coordinator of Dance since 1996, is a member of BalletMet Academy faculty, and was the founding Artistic Director of JazzMet. Ms. Kane has been a member of the national and international companies of American Dance Machine and has appeared in the national companies of Sugar and Bob Fosse's Dancin'. She has also made television appearances in productions such as PBS's Dance In America and The Ann Reinking Special with Ann Reinking, Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen. Ms. Kane has taught for New York's American Dance Machine/Harkness House, the Actor's and Director's Lab, Dance Educators of America, Dance Olympus, and Columbus Children's Theatre. She has given master classes at The Ohio State University, Bowling Green State University, Ohio Wesleyan, Kenyon College, and New York University. She has been a presenter for The Ohio Dance Festival and The International Network of Performing and Visual Arts' Conference. Her Choreography credits include not only an eclectic range of concert repertoire, but several musical theatre productions including Cabaret, A Chorus Line, Sweet Charity, Pippin, West Side Story, Oklahoma! and last season's The Secret Garden. During the summer 2002 season, Ms. Kane was a master teacher in residence at the Northern Ballet Theater in Leeds, England.

Kathy Bartelt (Choreographer) received her BFA in Dance from Texas Christian University. She danced two years with the Fort Worth Ballet and two years with the Third Street Moving Company. 

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


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Biographies
