

SYNOPSIS

Act One Prologue: 1815, Digne

After 19 years on the chain gang, Jean Valjean finds that the ticket-of-leave he must display condemns him to be an outcast. Only the Bishop of Digne treats him kindly and Valjean, embittered by years of hardship, repays him by stealing some silver. Valjean is caught and brought back by the police and is astonished when the Bishop lies to the police to save him. Valjean decides to start his life anew.

1823, Montreuil-Sur-Mer

Eight years have passed and Valjean, having broken his parole and changed his name to Monsieur Madeleine, has become a factory owner and Mayor. One of his workers, Fantine, has a secret illegitimate child. When the other women discover this, they demand her dismissal.

Desperate for money to pay for medicines for her daughter, Fantine sells her locket, her hair, and then joins the whores in selling herself. Utterly degraded, she gets into a fight with a prospective customer and is about to be taken to prison by Javert when the 'Mayor' arrives and demands she be taken to the hospital instead.

The Mayor then rescues a man pinned beneath a cart. Javert is reminded of the abnormal strength of convict 24601 Jean Valjean, who, he says, has just been recaptured. Valjean, unable to see an innocent man go to prison, confesses that he is prisoner 24601. At the hospital, Valjean promises the dying Fantine to find and look after her daughter Cosette. Javert arrives to arrest him, but Valjean escapes.

1823, Montfermeil

Cosette has been lodged with the Thenardiers, who horribly abuse her while indulging their own daughter, Eponine. Valjean pays the Thenardiers to let him take her away to Paris.

1832, Paris

Nine years later, there is unrest in the city because of the likely demise of the popular leader General Lamarque, the only man left in the government who shows any feeling for the poor. A street gang led by Thenardier and his wife sets upon Jean Valjean and Cosette. They are rescued by Javert, who does not recognize Valjean until he has gone.

The Thenardiers' daughter Eponine, who is secretly in love with the student Marius, reluctantly agrees to help him find Cosette, with whom he has fallen in love.

News of General Lamarque's death circulates in the city, and a group of politically-minded students stream out into the streets to whip up support for a revolution.

Cosette is consumed by thoughts of Marius, with whom she has fallen in love. Eponine brings Marius to Cosette and then prevents an attempt by her father's gang to rob Valjean's house. Valjean, convinced it was Javert lurking outside his house, tells Cosette they must prepare to flee the country.

Act Two

The students prepare to build the barricade. Marius, noticing that Eponine has joined the insurrection, sends her away with a letter to Cosette, which is intercepted by Valjean. Eponine decides to rejoin her love at the barricade.

The barricade is built and the revolutionaries defy an army warning to give up or die. Javert is exposed as a police spy. In trying to return to the barricade, Eponine is killed.

Valjean arrives at the barricade in search of Marius. He is given the chance to kill Javert but instead lets him go. The students settle down for a night on the barricade and, in the quiet of the night, Valjean prays to God to save Marius. The next day the rebels are all killed.

Valjean escapes into the sewers with the unconscious Marius. After meeting Thenardier, who is robbing the corpses of the rebels, he comes across Javert once more. He pleads for time to deliver the young man to the hospital. Javert lets Valjean go and, his unbending principles of justice having been shattered by Valjean's own mercy, he kills himself.

Unaware of the identity of his rescuer, Marius recovers in Cosette's care. Valjean confesses the truth of his past to Marius and insists he must go away. At Marius and Cosette's wedding, the Thenardiers try to blackmail Marius. Thenardier says Cosette's father is a murderer and as proof produces a ring which he stole from the corpse the night the barricade fell. It is Marius' own ring, and he realizes it was Valjean who rescued him that night. He and Cosette go to Valjean where Cosette learns, for the first time, her own history before Valjean dies.

PRODUCTION NOTE

Les Misérables is an epic tale that has been a part of literary history since 1862, when Victor Hugo's greatest novel was published. This story was taken to the stage in 1980. Since then, Les Misérables has won over 100 major theatrical awards, and remains an audience favorite.

Contrary to popular belief, *Les Misérables* is not based on The French Revolution, but instead revolves around The June Rebellion of 1832. During this time in France, the economy was crumbling due to lack of food and increased cost of living. To add to this stress, cholera had a major outbreak. Citizens believed the government was poisoning their water with cholera to control the population size.

The main event that sparked the June Rebellion was the death of General Lamarque, who was a popular leader among French citizens and student revolutionaries. Lamarque died of cholera, adding to the suspicions that the government was poisoning its citizens. When Lamarque's death was announced, groups of student revolutionaries, much like the Friends of the ABC, gathered at his funeral to give speeches on topics that Lamarque cared deeply about. During these speeches, a student waved a red flag and said, "Liberty or Death". Shots were fired into the crowd by police officers who were watching the gathering, and a battle ensued.

The Rebellion of 1832 started on June 5th and lasted for just one day, and approximately 800 revolutionaries were killed or injured. Victor Hugo's decision to base *Les Misérables* around this battle saved the event from being insignificant to history.

Otterbein University Department of Theatre and Dance is proud to be one of the first universities to present this piece of theatre history in its entirety. It has been an incredible journey for cast and crew alike. Please enjoy our production of *Les Misérables*.



TV credits include episodes of "Sex in the City," "Guiding Light" and various commercials. Lori Kay received her Bachelor's degree in Voice and Theatre from the Indiana University School of Music. She has been a member of the Otterbein Adjunct Faculty since 1999. Heather has been teaching Jazz Dance for the past 23 years, concentrating on Fosse, Cole, Giordano, and L.A. style techniques. She has taught for many private studios in the Columbus area including BalletMet Academy and Bartelt Dances. Heather has been involved in curriculum development for integratve arts in education courses. As former Dance Coordinator for the Delaware County Cultural Arts Center, Heather helped provide area public schools with an opportunity to use dance as an effective teaching tool in academics. Heather has danced professionally with Spectrum Dance Theater in Seattle, WA and with JazzMet in Columbus, OH. Her choreography credits include several original works for Otterbein Faculty Dance Concerts. During the summer of 2005, she presented her piece, "Passions" in the World Jazz Dance Congress in Chicago, IL. Her musical productions include School House Rock Live! (Otterbein, 2003); Barnum: The Spectacle (Otterbein 2004); The Sound of Music (2003); Once Upon A Mattress (2004) for The Pleasure Guild's Children's Hospital Benefit, and Life as a Cabaret (2003), an original production by Park Street Players of Columbus Children's Theatre. Other choreography credits include Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, The Miser, West Side Story, and The Unicorn the Gorgon and the Manticore.

Robert Behrens (Fight Choreographer) is an actor, director and fight director and is thrilled to be working with the talented *Les Mis* team. Robert has choreographed many Otterbein productions. He has worked for most of the theatres and universities in Central Ohio. Some highlights include work with the Great Lakes Theatre Festival in/on productions with Delroy Lindo - *Othello*, Richard Jordan - *Macbeth*, Hal Holbrook - *King Lear* and

Arthur Miller – *Up From Paradise*. He was privileged to work with Mr. Miller in London on his London premier of *Two Way Mirror* at The Young Vic, with Helen Mirren and Bob Peck, where he served as Assistant Director and Dialect Coach. Regional highlights include the Old Globe Theatre where he worked on *Romeo and Juliet* with Jon Tenney. He currently teaches stage combat and acting at Otterbein University. Robert is a proud member of Actors' Equity Association and The Society of American Fight Directors.

Rob Johnson (Scenic Designer) is a resident faculty scenic and lighting designer who joined the faculty in 1987. A full professor in the department, Rob teaches theatrical scenic design, scenic rendering, and computer graphics. He holds two masters degrees, one from West Virginia University where he studied scenic design, and the other from The Ohio State University where he earned his M.F.A. in lighting design. Rob recently wrote, performed, and recorded the musical composition "Pulse" for the recent Otterbein dance concert of the same name while on his sabbatical. He also designed the lighting for the The Fairy Queen at Ohio Wesleyen University and scenery for Chicago, produced by Shadowbox Live in German Village. He designed the scenery for all three Otterbein Summer Theatre productions: Almost Maine, Boeing Boeing, and Little Shop of Horrors, as well as the Westerville community theatre project, The Wizard of Oz. He gives thanks to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for all of his many opportunities and blessings.

Julia Ferreri (Costume Designer/ Costume Shop Supervisor) worked for The State University of New York at Potsdam as the Costume Shop Manager before joining the Otterbein University staff. She has also worked at Glimmerglass Opera, The Shakespeare Theatre in Washington DC, The Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival, Utah Shakespeare Festival, Heritage Theatre, and Berkshire Theatre Festival. Julia received her MFA in Costume Technology from Ohio University-Athens.

Joshua C. Allen* (Lighting Designer) @joshallen returns to Otterbein to light his 4th show in 15 years as a guest artist, including Twelfth Night (2000), The Music Man (2007), and The Secret Garden (2002). While he was a design-tech senior at the college in 1995, Josh lit the well- received production of A Few Good Men - a show for which he was awarded a Kennedy Center Meritorious Achievement Award. For the past six years, Josh has been a partner and principal consultant with Theatre Consultants Collaborative, an international firm that has designed hundreds of theaters, concert halls, and performance venues worldwide including the new Columbus Commons Amphitheatre, Live at Austin City Limits' new Moody Theatre, and Charleston's historic Dock Street Theatre to name a few (www.theatrecc.com). Josh regularly lectures on sustainability and design, and approached Les Misérables with a "green mind." Utilizing efficient new LED lighting technologies, the show you are attending is consuming approximately 2/3 less power than a typical Otterbein musical. In his home state of North Carolina, he has served as resident lighting designer for Duke University's Dance Dept., has lit productions for REP and Stillwater Theatre, and has designed the lighting for The Lost Colony outdoor drama - now in it's 76th season on NC's Outer Banks. When not working in a dark theatre, Josh maintains a true passion for social change and great coffee, and has married the two by co-founding the Full Circle Coffee Project (fullcirclecoffeeproject.org) with his wife Amy (Otterbein '95) - connecting coffee farmers with NGO's in their country of origin to effect change. The couple is currently producing a documentary being filmed in Guatemala, titled "Coffee for Lemonade" (CoffeeforLemonade.com), that shares how helping coffee farmers in rural Guatemala impacts the Guatemala City community of La Limonada - Central America's largest urban slum. Josh would like to thank his wife, Amy, and son, Sam for their never-ending love and support. CREATORS

Alain Boublil's first musical, La Revolution Française in 1973, marked his transition from songwriting to musical theatre and the start of his collaboration with Claude-Michel Schönberg with the hit album that became the first ever staged French musical. His idea of writing a musical version of Les Misérables brought them together again in 1978. The acclaimed show was written over a two-year period and recorded as an album before its opening at the Palais de Sports in Paris in September 1980. In 1983 Mr. Boublil met Cameron Mackintosh which led to his first London production Abbacadabra (a musical fairy-tale set to ABBA music) and to working with Claude-Michel and directors and writers on the English language adaptation of Les Misérables. The show has subsequently opened in 19 countries and 14 languages. Among the many awards Mr. Boublil has received were two Tony Awards in 1987 for Best Score and Best Book for the NY production and a 1988 Grammy for the Best Original Broadway Cast Recording which he co-produced with Claude-Michel Schönberg. Miss Saigon opened on September 20, 1989 at the Theatre Royal Drury Lane in London and on April 11, 1991 in NY. The show has also played in Tokyo and Toronto with future production scheduled for Sydney, Australia and Stuttgart, Germany. Mr. Boublil will maintain a close association with all the international productions of Les Misérables and Miss Saigon while working with Claude-Michel on the screenplays for motion picture versions of both musicals.

Claude-Michel Schönberg is a successful record producer and songwriter who began his collaboration with Alain Boublil in 1973, writing the very first French musical, La Revolution Française. Mr. Schönberg played the role of Louis XVI in that production and also co-produced the double-gold record album of the show. In 1974, he recorded an album, singing his own compositions and lyrics, which included the number one hit single "Le Premier Pas." In 1980, after two years' work on the score, Mr. Schönberg and Mr. Boublil's musical Les Misérables opened in Paris, where it was seen by more than 1.5 million people. In 1983, Mr. Schönberg produced an opera album in Paris with Julia Migenes Johnson and the Monte Carlo Philharmonic Orchestra. Following work on the London production of Les Misérables (the 3rd longest running musical in British theatre history), Mr. Schönberg co-produced the double-platinum London cast album and became involved in casting all the major overseas productions of the show, including the American, Japanese and Australian companies. He won two coveted Tony Awards, for Best Score and Book, for the Broadway production of Les Misérables and a Grammy Award for the Best Original Cast Recording, which he co-produced with Alain Boublil. He also worked closely on the symphonic recording of the show. His score for Miss Saigon, again written in collaboration with Alain Boublil, is now repeating the international success story of Les Misérables. Produced by Cameron Mackintosh and again bringing together many members of the creative team behind Les Misérables, Miss Saigon opened with huge success at the Theatre Royal Drury Lane in London in September 1989, in NY in April 1991, in Tokyo in May 1992 and in Chicago (the first national U.S. tour) in November 1992. Future productions will open in Sydney, Australia and Stuttgart, Germany. Now Claude-Michel is back at the keyboards, composing their next musical, Martin Guerre, while keeping close eye on the development of the screenplays for Les Misérables and Miss Saigon.

Herbert Kretzmer, born in South Africa, came to London in 1954, and has since pursued twin careers as a newspaperman and songwriter. He was a feature writer at the Daily Sketch and a profile writer at the Sunday Dispatch. He joined the Daily Express in 1960 and later became its drama critic, a post he held for 18 years. Since 1979 he has been writing TV criticism for the Daily Mail and has won, in this capacity, two national press awards. As a lyric writer he wrote weekly songs for BBC-TV's "That Was The Week That Was." He won an Ivor Novello Award for the Peter Sellers/Sophia Loren comedy song "Goodness Gracious Me." Other award-winning lyrics include two written for Charles Aznavour: "Yesterday When I Was Young" and the chart-topping "She." Mr. Kretzmer wrote book and lyrics for the West End's Our Man Crichton, which starred Kenneth More and Millicent Martin, and lyrics for the Theatre Royal Drury Lane's The Four Musketeers. He also supplied lyrics for the Anthony Newly film "Can Heironymous Merkin Ever Forget Mercy Humppe And Find True Happiness?" Tony Award, 1987, Best Score, Les Misérables.
