The Guggenheim Fellowship will enable Hill to continue his studio research in India and England.

The purpose of the grant is to increase the retention of young adolescent girls in schools in West Nile Uganda through Menstrual Hygiene Management, Sexual Reproductive Health Education, and through empowerment through personal narrative writing. Trained teachers in month-long training in January and May of 2017 and worked with sixty girls in three different schools on writing personal narratives about their lives to encourage personal empowerment in July 2017.

EXTERNAL GRANT AWARDS – OFFICE OF GRANTS AND SPONSORED PROGRAMS

Otterbein faculty and administrators have received one grant since the last update. During fiscal year 2018, one proposal received \$22,500 in awards. Ranging widely from research to academic studies to community education, these grants support the mission of Otterbein, enhance faculty achievement and student learning, and strengthen social justice in the central Ohio community.

Ohio Department of Natural Resources, *Mussel
Survey for ODNR* (\$22,500)

All native mussels are protected in the State of Ohio, as are ten federally listed species that live in the state. For the duration of this grant, Dr. Hoggarth and his team of divers will conduct a baseline survey of the mussel population in a specific region of the Portage River, beginning in the 3,400 foot long and 70-foot wide Portage River Fishing Access boating channel and concluding where it joins the main channel of the Portage River. If impacts on the mussels and their habitat cannot be avoided, a detailed survey of the mussel streams and potential habitats must be completed before stream disturbance or relocation is considered. If mussels are found, Dr. Hoggarth and his team will also relocate them.
