Aug 7th 1856

At Uncle, Calts,

Dear Mother

I had a quick trip and very pleasant excepting between Cleveland & Dunkirk which was very dusty it rained all the distance from Albany to Poughkeepsie they were expecting me on Tuesday the girls have spent one week over the river. to day we go to Hamberge. and thus we shall go to all the places as soon as possible, I'll say we shall not leave under a month we are very well at this time and expect a pleasant visit Uncle will finish harvest this week if it should not rain any more I am sitting at the window in the back room

the air is nice from the river
I shall be home as soon
as I can get around it may
be little over 2 weeks or it
may be under just as things
go pleasant, or not

if you want us home sooner
just write you and Aunt
must ride out and visit by
you can spend a visit out East
