## From the Chair...

As we begin a new academic year, I bring you news of transitions and arrivals. First – we made it through our first year under semesters! Yes, there were bumps in the road as we implemented revised curriculum, new class schedules, new concert calendars, new ... well, new everything! But with much goodwill from faculty and students alike, the pilot year is done and we can actually begin to enjoy our new semester schedule – including an earlier release time in the summer, a fall break, and the benefits of having only two sets of juries and final exams instead of three over the academic year.

There have been personal transitions here as well. We congratulate Dr. Michael Haberkorn on his retirement at the end of Spring 2012, after 33 years of service to the department and the University. I have known Michael as a musician, colleague and friend since I came to Otterbein 12 years ago. Michael created the yearly faculty piano duo/ensemble concert called  $2 \times 6$ , and I was pleased to partner with him in performing piano duets and duos on many of these recitals over the years.

We welcome Dr. Nicholas Ross as our new associate professor and director of keyboard studies. In addition to teaching piano, Dr. Ross also gives instruction in music theory, aural skills, and teaches an interdisciplinary course, Music and Ideology. Prior to his arrival at Otterbein, Ross was a professor at Sweet Briar College in Virginia where he was the music department chair from 2005 until 2012. Dr. Ross earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in piano performance from Rice University in Houston, Texas, and also holds degrees in piano performance from the Twente Conservatory (now called

ArtEz) in Holland and Trinity College of Music in London, as well as a master's degree in applied mathematics from Twente University.

Please join me in welcoming Dr. Ross, his spouse, Jana, a professional violinist, and their sons, Piers and Liam, to Otterbein.

> With Dr. Ross's arrival, we are inaugurating a Keyboard Series of recitals, with performances scheduled throughout the year, including Guest Artist Teresa Walters, "International First Lady of the Piano," and members of our faculty including Dr. Ross, Jennifer Bell, Tim Huffman, Dr. Richard Lopez and Dr. Suzanne Newcomb. Details are within this newsletter.

While you are marking your calendar, be sure to come to our second annual Collage Concert, on Sunday, Oct. 21, at 7 p.m. in the Fritsche Theatre

at Cowan Hall. Featuring an array of ensembles, small groups and soloists, this concert showcases the entire music department, and involves nearly every student. The \$15 admission (students admitted free of charge) benefits the Craig Johnson Fund for the Future of Music at Otterbein.
