

Biographies

Pamela Hill (Director) is delighted to return to her alma mater having directed previous productions of *Once Upon a Mattress*, *Wind in the Willows* and *The World Goes Round*. Based in Columbus, she directs professionally across the country. Recent productions include *The Robber Bridegroom* for the Hartt School (CT), *A Funny Thing Happened*... (WV) and *Cabaret* for Wittenberg University. In Central Ohio she has directed CATCO's *Blithe Spirit* and *The Good Times are Killing Me*. A former OAC panelist, Pam received an MA from Bowling Green State University and studied at London's Royal Academy of Dramatic Art. She is married to actor Michael Lorr and would like to dedicate this production in memory of her step-brother Bruce.

Michael Thomas (Choreographer) is a native of Columbus, OH. Michael's training and experience of dance and theatre is diverse and widespread. Currently in pursuit of a MFA specializing in choreography from OSU, he is creating work which merges the vocabulary of American Musical Theatre and modern dance. Michael has both danced with and worked on the artistic staff of BalletMet Columbus as well as teaching in the academy. Michael has been a company member of JazzMet under the direction of Stella Kane, the Empire State Ballet of Buffalo New York, and as an instructor at numerous schools, including Otterbein College. He finds a variety of work performing, choreographing and directing theatrical and commercial work in ballet, modern dance, ethnic styles, and of course, tap. Upon completion of his degree, Michael plans to join the staff of a liberal arts college in the Midwest or East Coast. "I credit this profession for allowing me to better understand and appreciate the diversity of human existence."

David Monseur (Musical Director) is completing his first year as Visiting Instructor with the Department of Music at Otterbein. He conducts the Otterbein Men's and Women's Choruses in addition to Opus One, the College's vocal jazz ensemble. He also teaches conducting, music theory, voice class, and aural skills. David is currently a Ph.D. candidate at The Ohio

State University where he conducted the University Chorus and served as Assistant Conductor of the Men's Glee Club. He holds degrees from The Ohio State University and Westminster Choir College. David has numerous credits as a soloist and member of the Westminster Choir. He also has been recently named as Artistic Director of the Columbus Gay Men's Chorus and is Director of Music at St. Elizabeth Catholic Church, Columbus.

Beth Burrier-Bradstreet (Vocal Director/Keyboards) is an accompanist and voice teacher for the Thomas Worthington Choral Program. She is also adjunct faculty at Otterbein, working with Opus Zero, Otterbein's Musical Theatre ensemble. She has been involved in over forty musicals, including *Falsettos*, *Assassins*, *Anything Goes*, *Quilters*, and *Sweeney Todd*. She was awarded a certificate of excellence from the region's American College Theatre Festival for her musical direction of Otterbein's production of 1776. She recently performed as the piano soloist with the Central Ohio Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Bradstreet is a singing member and the assistant conductor of VocalBaroque, a professional choir in Columbus.

Rob Johnson (Lighting Designer) is our resident scenic designer in his tenth year at Otterbein. Rob won last year's Ezekiel Design Award for lighting Otterbein's *Phantom*. The Ezekiel is awarded by the Ohio Valley Section of The United States Institute of Theatre Technology (USITT) for outstanding design work and includes academic and professional companies from all over the states of Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Kentucky. Recent lighting designs include *A Chorus Line* at Otterbein, *Sisters* at CATCO, and *Artscape*, a festival of the performing arts at The Capitol Theatre in Columbus. To date, he has designed over 100 productions. Rob continues to be at the forefront of computer-aided design and animation. He is currently doing freelance work in computer graphics, animation, and web design and teaches courses at Otterbein in the use of this technology. Rob would like to dedicate his work in memory of his father.

Eric Lubkeman (Costume Designer) studied musical theatre at The Ohio State University. He performed for several seasons in summer stock and has acted in regional and national commercials and video. For the past 15 years he has concentrated on costume design, designing over 250 productions. His costuming has taken him to Edinburgh, Scotland for the Fringe Festival. He has worked for Club Med International resorts as part of the entertainment team working in Mexico and the Dominican Republic. This Spring will find his costumes in a Video Installation by New York artists Judith Berry and Brad Miskell at the Wexner Center for the Arts. Eric's designs are also featured currently in a national tour of *The Hobbit* for Cleveland Sign Stage Theatre. Eric is an accomplished painter and is a member of Acme Art Company and The Columbus Art League. He shows locally and nationally and at any given time has 100 works of art on view in and around the Columbus Area.

Dana White (Lighting Designer) has lit many shows at Otterbein. Some of his favorite projects include *To Kill A Mockingbird*, *Trojan Women*, *Picasso Does My Maps*, and *Marcus is Walking*. His lighting design for *Pippin* won a Finalist Award for the annual Ezekiel Awards by the Ohio Valley section of the United States Institute for Theatre Technology. He is also an Associate Artist for the Purple Rose Theatre Company. The Purple Rose is Jeff Daniel's professional Equity company based in Chelsea, MI dedicated to the development of new plays. He has lit several original scripts there including *Stanton's Garage*, *Possessed*; *The Dracula Musical*, and *Apartment 3A*. Current projects include a tour of *They Do It With Mirrors*, a one woman show with Hillary Ramsden, *All Night Strut!* which recently opened Cleveland's restored Hanna Theatre, and *Escanaba in da Moonlight* an original script by Jeff Daniels which has broken nearly every attendance record in Michigan. He is also working on a new play by renowned playwright, Lanford Wilson this spring.

Marcia Hain (Shop Supervisor) graduated with a BS in Home Economics from OSU in 1977. After many years in commercial business costuming, Marci joined the Otterbein Tech team in 1989. Since then, she has run the Costume Shop full time, and has designed 1776, Once Upon A Mattress, Night Watch, Sherlock's Last Case, and A Few Good Men. She also served as Associate Designer on Phantom. Other credits include: Harrigan & Hart (Players Theatre), Salome (Opera/Columbus), Camelot (Maine State Music Theatre), as well as various high school and community theatreproductions around the state.


