

**ABOUT "Damn Yankees":** 

Damn Yankees opened on Broadway on May 5, 1955. The production team included an up-and-comer whose only previous Broadway choreography credit was *The Pajama Game*, which had opened exactly a year earlier with exactly the same production team as *Damn Yankees*. That choreographer was Bob Fosse. Damn Yankees also produced one of the most prolific and well known dance collaborations of that era by introducing the dancer Gwen Verdon to Fosse. Together they created a sensation with dance hits like "Whatever Lola Wants" and "Who's Got the Pain" (the only song Verdon and Fosse ever danced on film together in the movie version of *Damn Yankees*.) Gwen became the quintessential Fosse dancer and Bob, who wanted to be the next Fred Astaire, went on to create a legacy that was all his own. (compiled by Colleeen McKnight, Dramaturg)

# **Biographies**

Kathy Bartelt (Choreographer) received her B.F.A. in Dance from Texas Christian University. She danced two years with the Fort Worth Ballet and two years with the Third Street Morning Company. She has taught for Ohio State University Continuing Education and Fort Hayes Career Center. She currently directs her own dance studio in Upper Arlington, coaches with Columbus Rhythmic Gymnastics, and choreographs the fall productions for Jones Middle School.

George Boft (Choreographer) graduated from the distinguished Ballet Academy of the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow. As a ballet soloist at the Bolshoi Theatre, George performed with the company for twenty years, dancing lead roles in much of the classical repertoire. During that time he toured extensively with the Bolshoi, performing in 32 countries across Europe, Asia, Africa and Australia. Employed as Artistic Director of the Ballet of the Moscow Operetta Theatre, George also taught and coached at the Bolshoi Academy. Since arriving in this country in 1990 he is teaching and occasionally performing on stage at Ballet Met. From 1992 he has been a dance instructor at Otterbein College.

Beth Burrier-Bradstreet (Musical Director Act II) has been an integral part of musical theatre at Otterbein College since 1997. She was awarded a Certificate of Excellence from the American College Theatre Festival for her musical direction of Otterbein's production of 1776. Recent credits Narnia, Jesus Christ Superstar and A Little Night Music were included on the Columbus Dispatch Best Local Theatre List for 1999. Beth teaches voice for performance and solo singing at her studio, and is an accompanist and voice teacher for the Thomas Worthington High School Choral Program. Her voice students are winners of many regional awards and scholarships, and have been accepted as performance majors at the Boston Conservatory, Otterbein College, NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and the University of Michigan. Beth dedicates her work in memory of her father.

Kris Cross (Choreographer) has performed in and choreographed for regional dance companies along the East Coast including The Big Apple; Philadelphia, PA; Washington D. C.; Baltimore, MD; and both Carolinas. Kris has taught all ages and has been involved in musical theatre choreography in all of these states as well as here in Columbus. She holds an M.F.A. in Choreography as a Graduate Fellow from OSU and an M.Ed. in Dance from Temple University. Kris has been honored with special appointments by the National Endowment for the Arts and The Ohio Arts Council. She serves as Executive Board member of OhioDance and Advisory Board member of Fort Hayes Arts and Academic High School.

Jon Devlin (Choreographer) is currently in his thirteenth year of teaching at Otterbein College. Jon is the creator of "Dancercise" in New York ('67-'86) and the organizer of "Tangofest" ('96-'97). He has been a soloist for the American Dance Festival, and has choreographed for The American Dance Machine, "Manhattan Rhythm" at the Savoy Theatre in NYC, and off-Broadway's "Tango". He has appeared in print with The New York Times, Vogue, Redbook, and Cosmopolitan, and on screen with "Good Morning, America", "CBS News", and "ABC's Eyewitness News". Jon is currently involved in organizing a weekend workshop in Downtown Columbus entitled "Body, Mind, and Rhythm", which will be held June 9-11. You can visit his website at www.dansync.com.

Marcia Hain (Costume Designer, Costume Shop Supervisor) has been a member of the Otterbein Theatre Tech Staff since 1989. Since then she has run the Costume Shop full time and has also designed such shows as *Night Watch*, *Sherlock's Last Case*, and *A Few Good Men*, *Once Upon a Mattress*, and *1776*. She also served as Associate Designer for *Phantom*. Ms. Hain has an extensive background in Home Economics as well as commercial costuming, and has free lance designed and built for reigional, community, and high school theatres.

Stella Hiatt Kane (Artistic Director) has been a member of the Otterbein faculty since 1989 and Coordinator of Dance since 1996, a member of the BalletMet Academy faculty, and the founding Artistic Director of JazzMet. Ms. Kane has been a member of the national and international companies of American Dance Machine and has appeared in the national companies of Sugar and Bob Fosse's Dancin'. She has also made television appearances in productions such as PBS's "Dance In America" and "The Ann Reinking Special" with Ann Reinking, Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen. Ms. Kane has taught for New York's American Dance Machine/Harkness House, the Actor's and Director's Lab, Dance Educators of America, Dance Olympus, and Columbus Children's Theatre. She has given master classes at The Ohio State University, Bowling Green State University, Ohio Wesleyan, Kenyon College, and New York University. Ms. Kane has been a presenter for The Ohio Dance Festival and The International Network of Performing and Visual Arts' Conference. Her choreography credits include not only an eclectic range of concert repertoire, but several musical theatre productions including Cabaret, A Chorus Line, 1940's Radio Hour, Sweet Charity, and Pippin.

Dan Knechtges (Choreographer/Director Act II) is a 1994 graduate of Otterbein College. Some of his more recent productions include *Funny Thing* at the Surflight Theater, *Hansel and Gretel* at the Capital City Opera, *Salome* at the Shreveport Opera, *The Merry Widow* at Opera Illinois and *Grease* and *Crazy for You* at the Shawnee Playhouse. Knechtges also staged the Blue Hill Troupe's 75th Anniversary concert for Carnegie Hall and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. Knechtges also worked with the Blue Hill Troupe on *Gondoliers*, *H.M.S. Pinafore* and *The Sorcerer*. He previously worked on *Damn Yankees* in New York with Wagner College. Knechtges also had the honor of assisting Randy Skinner on City Center's Encores production of *Do Re Mi* starring Nathan Lane. He is currently on the dance faculty of several schools in the New York area.

David S. Mead (Sound Consultant) has been involved in all aspects of entertainment production for twenty-five years. As an audio designer, he has worked on national touring productions of Ken Hill's *Phantom of the Opera*, *The Fantasticks*, and the Great Radio City Music Hall Spectacular. Otterbein College productions include 1776, Crazy For You, Cabaret, Twelfth Night, and A Little Night Music. Mead is the performance audio engineer for the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra. He is CEO of Live! Technologies, an Ohio based production sales and services company. Mead is a 1972 graduate of Miami University.

Dana White (Lighting Designer Act II) is Associate Professor of Lighting, Sound, and Stage Management. Otterbein audiences may remember his Sound Design for *Death of a Salesman* and Lighting Design for *A Little Night Music*. He has designed several original productions including the World Premier of *Book of Days* by Lanford Wilson, winner of the Grand Prize "Best Play of 1998", and *Brave New World* with Columbus Dance Theatre. Recent projects include, *All Night Strut!* at Cleveland's HannahTheatre, and the long running comedy, *Escanba in da Moonlight* at the historic Gem Theatre in Detroit, MI. Mr. White is an Associate Artist at the Purple Rose Theatre, and a member of United Scenic Artists Local 829.

Heather White-Cotterman (Choreographer) is from Columbus, OH, and has danced professionally with Spectrum Dance Theatre in Seattle, WA. She is an alumna of Otterbein College with a BA in choreography and a BSE in elementary education. She also teaches at Bartelt Dancers in Upper Arlington, OH.
