





1921-Present


In 2016 Tau Delta was the first sorority to win Otterbein’s Martin Luther King, Jr. Peace and Justice Award.



TALISMAN—Tau Epsilon Mu

1914-Present
The only sorority to be "caught" and forced to disband before "social clubs" were allowed on campus.



ALPs - Alpha Beta Sigma

Active 1908-33

One of the first fraternities founded at Otterbein, in 1933 it merged with Sigma Delta Phi (Sphinx).




ANNEX—Pi Beta Sigma

1908-Present

One of the two oldest fraternities at Otterbein, they are known for their community service projects and charity work.



POLYGON—Eta Beta Pi

1912-32

Otterbein's second sorority. Though they existed for two decades, little is known about them.




PHOENIX—Psi Theta Pi

Not much is known about Phoenix, as it was only on campus for eleven years.



In the days when Greeks were forbidden on campus, the ladies told the faculty that EKT stood for "Earnestness, Kindness, and Truth."




ARKADY—Rho Kappa Delta

Over the course of 64 years this sorority has deactivated and reactivated several times—perhaps it will come back again?



The Scottie Dog has been their mascot since 1954, and their favorite dance is the Highland Fling.




LOTUS—Theta Phi

Not much is known about Lotus, as it was only on campus for eight years.



1915-31


In 1931 Cook House was one of the two fraternities that merged to become Zeta Phi.

1908-Present


One of the two first fraternities, they currently reside in the former home of Ernest Cherrington, the "Godfather of the 18th Amendment" (Prohibition).

1921-31

In 1931 Lakota was one of the two fraternities that merged to become Zeta Phi.




JONDA—Eta Phi Mu

1922-Present

This fraternity has been in its current house longer than any other Greek organization, having moved there the same year that these cartoons were drawn (1929).
