She has also performed at the Nebraska Repertory Theatre, Illinois Shakespeare Festival, Briar Street Theatre and in the Joseph Jefferson Award-winning production of Kabuki Medea. The perfect antidote to her hectic life in the theatre is the time she spends with husband, Tim Veach, and their two children, Judson and Maggie.

Rob Johnson (Scenic Designer) is in his 15th year as a professor in the Department of Theatre & Dance at Otterbein College, where he teaches theatrical design and computer graphics & animation. Last quarter he designed the setting for *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, recently named by the Columbus Dispatch as one of the top ten productions for 2001. He will be lighting our next show, *The Mikado*, to be produced in the Batelle Fine Arts Center, and will design scenery again for the upcoming family musical, *The Secret Garden*. Rob will also be designing the set for the upcoming production of *Having Our Say*, to be produced at the Vern Riffe Center in April by the Contemporary American Theatre Company (CATCO). 
