



DIRECTORS

CHARLES W. DODRILL, Director of Theatre at Otterbein College since 1958, holds an M.A. from Kansas University and a Ph.D. from Ohio State. Dr. Dodrill is past president of the Columbus Arts Council and the Ohio Speech Association, and the current national president of Theta Alpha Phi Dramatics Honorary. He is responsible for many innovations in the Otterbein Theatre Program, including the "guest star" and Repertory Theatre Programs, and the Summer Theatre Program. Kiss Me Kate is the 56th production he has directed at Otterbein.

JOANNE VAN SANT is Dean of Students at Otterbein. A native Kentuckian, she holds a B.A. degree from Denison University with an M.A. from Ohio State. She began teaching at Otterbein in 1948 and has served actively as choreographer or assistant choreographer in every musical since, including Knickerbocker Holiday, The Student Prince, Oklahoma!, Brigadoon in 1956 and 1967, Carousel, The Music Man, My Fair Lady, Camelot, Fiddler on the Roof, and Canterbury Tales.

FRED J. THAYER, Designer-Technical Director at Otterbein since 1960, is a graduate of Bowling Green University with an M.A. in Theatre. He has completed residency requirements for the Ph.D. at Ohio State. Mr. Thayer has designed for the University of Toledo, Toledo's Children's Theatre, Bowling Green, and Huron Playhouse. He has designed and technical directed over 90 productions (about 75 at Otterbein.)

LYLE BARKHYMER, Professor of woodwinds, conducting, and music history, is a native Pennsylvanian. He is a graduate of Otterbein with M.M. and D.M. degrees from Indiana University. He was a scholarship student at Chautauqua, New York, and has been a member of Pittsburgh's Waterfront American Wind Symphony. In August, Dr. Barkhymer will assume the duties of Dean of the RCIE European-American Study Centre in Basel, Switzerland (for two years).

WILLIAM WYMAN, Assistant Professor of Voice and Music Education, is Director of the Concert Choir and Producer-Director of the Opera Theatre. He came to Otterbein from West Virginia University, with M.M. and D.M. degrees, where he was Producer-Director of the Children's Opera Theatre and Music Director of the Summer Opera Theatre. His Children's Opera Theatre was the subject of two documentaries filmed for N.E.T. He has directed or performed over 25 operas.

PETIE DODRILL is a native Pennsylvanian with a B.A. degree from Penn State and an M.F.A. in Theatre from Ohio University. She has worked as an actress, director, designer and costume designer for several theatres, and she functions as Costume Designer and Children's Theatre Director at Otterbein. She is a part-time drama teacher at Gahanna Lincoln High School.

Over 120 families, individuals, groups or businesses have contributed \$10 or more (tax deductible) to help establish the Summer Theatre and to pay small monetary stipends to company personnel. We have adopted this practice in order to secure qualified students. We need a minimum of \$1,000 to support the personnel currently planned for the 1974 season.

All current THEATRE PATRONS are listed in each program. In addition, THEATRE PATRONS who are also season ticket holders have the option of purchasing up to four additional tickets per production at the reduced season ticket rates.

COMPANY PERSONNEL

Dr. Charles Dodrill, Director of Theatre, will direct PRESENT LAUGHTER and THE IMPOSSIBLE YEARS, the opening and closing productions.

Dennis Romer, recent graduate and currently professional actor, will be Assistant Managing Director and will direct COME BLOW YOUR HORN. Dennis will also appear in lead roles in PRESENT LAUGHTER, THE FANTASTICKS and THE IMPOSSIBLE YEARS.

Lloyd Lewis, Executive Director of the Columbus Junior Theatre of the Arts, (an Otterbein grad and former choreographer here) returns to Otterbein as director of THE FANTASTICKS.

Another director and play will be announced.

Prof. Fred Thayer, Designer-Technical Director at Otterbein, will function in the same capacity for the summer. He will be assisted by Marty Bookwalter, who will also design COME BLOW YOUR HORN.

Mrs. Petie Dodrill, Children's Theatre Director and Costume Designer at Otterbein, will function in that capacity for the summer. She will be assisted in costumes by Linda Thayer.

Approximately 20 students will comprise the basic acting and technical company. Returning actors include Richarr Miller, Jerry Confer, Beth Machlan, Tony DelValle, Julie Sickles, Pam Hill and Dennis Romer. Others are Gian Morelli, Jim West and Sharon Bichnell from the University of Miami. Others include Robyn Pruett, Judith Easton, James Dooley, Leslie Young and Pamela Burns.
