DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Gotta Dance!

That's the impulse that drives this dazzling gem of a musical. One glorious number after another will make you want to tap your feet and sway to the music. It is inspiring to see these young artists dive into this material with such enthusiasm and gusto. Stella Hiatt Kane and Anna Elliott bring these thrilling numbers to life through their spectacular choreography. Along with all of the foot stomping good fun, *Singin' in the Rain* also provides us with an important message, still relevant and timely today.

An aching need for dignity and authenticity is what causes the hero of our story, Don Lockwood, to confront his worst fear: losing the approval of others and the status and power that goes with that approval. The stakes are very high.

As the play begins, Don has it all: fame, fortune and a public that adores him. He can't help but cater to their needs. If Don Lockwood and Lina Lamont can have it all, then maybe the rest of us can too. The pressure to make the world believe that narrative is enormous. Because Don and Lina are at the top, they have everything to lose. When Kathy Selden enters Don's life, a portal opens for him. Kathy helps Don discover his intrinsic sense of self-worth and dignity.

Singin' in the Rain gives us the heightened reality of an MGM musical to highlight the ways in which we create our own realities. Whatever we believe can become true. If we just close our eyes and imagine, we can make anything happen, even a BROADWAY MELODY production number. The heightened reality of a musical allows us to witness what might be possible. The realities that we create in our minds can come to life with vivid color and vibrancy. In this world, anything is possible, if we just choose to dream it into existence.

Christina Kirk, Director

BIOGRAPHIES

Christina Kirk (Director/Artistic Director/Producer) is Chair of the Department of Theatre and Dance at Otterbein University where she has taught since 1992. Her directing credits include The Living Theatre, New Dramatists, and assisting Liviu Ciulei at Arena Stage. Favorite directing projects at Otterbein include The Caucasian Chalk Circle, King Richard III, and Nine. She has also directed and performed for Otterbein Summer Theatre. Favorite summer projects include The 39 Steps, Barefoot in the Park, and The Understudy. She has performed at the Illinois Shakespeare Festival, the Nebraska Repertory Theatre, the İllinois Repertory Theatre, CATCO, and in the Joseph Jefferson award winning Kabuki Medea. Favorite roles include "B" in Three Tall Women at CATCO, Violet in August: Osage County at Otterbein, and, more recently, the title roles in Cleopatra and Claudel at Columbus Dance Theatre. Claudel received the Artistic Excellence Award by the Greater Columbus Arts Council and Cleopatra was nominated for this same award. Her one-woman show, which premiered at Columbus Dance Theatre, was featured in the March 2006 Theatre Journal. And, most recently, she had the pleasure of reading her daughter Margret Veach's poetry in an evening of her work at Columbus Dance Theatre. Kirk has an M.F.A. in Directing from Columbia University and a B.F.A. in acting from the University of Illinois. She is also a certified yoga instructor.

Lori Kay Harvey (Music Director) is in her 11th year as a member of the musical theatre faculty at Otterbein. She has music directed over 35 shows in central Ohio and throughout the US, and has performed extensively as an actor/ singer/ dancer on both national and international tours and in numerous regional theatres. Recent Otterbein credits include Big Fish, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Adding Machine: A Musical, Damn Yankees and The Addams Family. Tour credits: Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (National), Grease (Brazil), Regional: Next to Normal (SRO Theatre Co.), Beauty and the Beast (Ordway Center, MN), Jekyll and Hyde (Arvada Center, CO), The Taffetas (Totem Pole Playhouse, PA), Camelot (Westchester Broadway Theatre, NY), The Who's Tommy, Damn Yankees (Mill Mountain Theatre, VA), Brigadoon, Carousel, The Desert Song (Media Theatre, PA), and The Good War (Weathervane Playhouse, OH). In 2014, she received nominations from both BroadwayWorld Columbus and the 10th Annual Jebby Awards for Best Actress in a Musical for her role as Diana in Next to Normal with the SRO Theatre Company in Columbus, OH. She won Best Musical Director from BroadwayWorld Columbus for Les Misérables at Otterbein in 2014. Television credits: Sex in the City, Guiding Light, Mel Torme's Christmas Special, and various commercials and industrials, Education: BS in Voice Performance and Theatre from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. Member of Actor's Equity Association.

Stella Kane (Choreographer) is the Director of Musical Theatre and Director of Dance at Otterbein University and the founding Artistic Director of JazzMet. Ms. Kane has been a member of the national companies of Sugar and Bob Fosses' Dancin' and a member of the national and international companies of *The American Dance Machine*. She has made television appearances in productions such as PBS' Dance in America and The Ann Reinking Special with Ann Reinking, Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen. Ms. Kane has taught for New York's American Dance Machine/Harkness House and the Actors' and Directors' Lab. She has been a visiting guest artist/teacher at several universities including The Ohio State University and New York University and has been a master teacher in residence at the Northern Ballet Theatre in Leeds, England. She has also been a guest choreographer for BalletMet and Columbus Dance Theatre, including the recent world premiere of Women Leading. Her most current Otterbein collaborations have included Big Fish, Damn Yankees, Thoroughly Modern Millie and Oklahoma! Additionally, she has directed and choreographed for the recent Otterbein University dance concerts Famously Yours...Forever, The Goddess, Move Me and Gloriously Grimm. A special thanks to Anna for this collaboration and her incredible work, Additional thanks to André, Bradford, Abby, and Kevin.

Anna Elliott (Choreographer) has been a member of the dance faculty at Otterbein University Department of Theatre and Dance since 2013. She teaches Tap, Jazz and Ballet. Born and raised in Ohio, Anna began studying dance at a very young age. She has extensive training in Tap, Jazz, Ballet and Musical Theater. During her professional career, Anna became a Radio City Rockette at the age of 18. She was fortunate enough

to be a part of this legendary group of women for 8 years. While with the Rockettes, she performed on the Today Show, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, Rockefeller Christmas Tree Lighting, The Rachel Ray Show, and the Nate Berkus Show. Anna performed in many other televised appearances locally and nationally as a Rockette. She was a part of many commercials for the Radio City Christmas Show and you can find her in the 75th Celebration Edition book titled, Radio City Spectacular. Anna was also a part of the ensemble in the First National Broadway Tour of 42nd Street choreographed by Randy Skinner, and performed in many theaters across the country. With Otterbein, she debuted her choreography with her piece "Unconditional" in Dance 2017: Move Me, as well as choreographing "Cinderella" in Dance 2018: Gloriously Grimm. Anna was the Associate Choreographer next to Stella Kane for Otterbein's production of Thoroughly Modern Millie. Other choreography credits include Westerville's Summer Children's Theater productions of *Lion King Ir* and *Aladdin Ir*, as well as Westerville South's production of Little Shop of Horrors. Anna is also a Professional Dance Coach and mentor where she helps develop students to achieve their theater and dance dreams. Singin' in the Rain has been a dream show come true! Rob Johnson (Scenic and Projections Designer) is a full professor with the Department of Theatre & Dance at Otterbein University and also serves as the Associate Artistic Director for the department. With Otterbein since 1987, Rob teaches scenic design, scenic rendering, model-making, computer-aided drafting and several specialty courses in computer graphics. Recent design work at Otterbein includes the settings for *Macbeth, Big Fish,* and *Thoroughly Modern Millie.* Rob has designed scenery and/or lighting for hundreds of productions throughout his career including musicals, drama, dance concerts, and opera. He has won numerous Ezekiel Awards for his design work. In addition to an undergraduate degree from Bowling Green State University, he holds two graduate degrees: a Master of Arts from West Virginia University and a Master of Fine Arts from The Ohio State University. He would, as always, like to praise Jesus Christ for a life full of many personal blessings and a wonderful career.

Julia Ferreri (Costume Designer) has been building and designing costumes for over fifteen years. Favorite Otterbein designs include Adding Machine: A Musical, Fiddler on the Roof, The Crucible, Les Misérables, and The Full Monty. Kristen Cooperkline (Production Manager) joined the Otterbein family in 2013. The team of Betty Comden and Adolph Green, 1991 recipients of the Kennedy Center Honors, and the longest running creative partnership in theatre history, began writing and performing their own satirical comic material in a group called The Revuers, which included the late Judy Holliday. They went on to collaborate with Leonard Bernstein and Jerome Robbins on what was the first show for all of them, On The Town. Also with Mr. Bernstein, they collaborated on the score for Wonderful Town. With Jule Styne they wrote the book and/or lyrics for Bells Are Ringing, Do Re Mi, Subways Are For Sleeping, Peter Pan, and others. They also wrote the book for Applause, the book and lyrics for On the Twentieth Century and the lyrics for The Will Rogers Follies, with Cy Coleman, and A Doll's Life. Five of these, Applause, Hallelujah Baby, Wonderful Town, On the Twentieth Century and The Will Rogers Follies won them six Tony Awards, and A Doll's Life, a Tony nomination. Their many film musicals include Singin' in the Rain, The Band Wagon, On the Town, Bells are Ringing, It's Always Fair Weather, Good News and The Barkleys of Broadway. Their non-musicals include Auntie Mame and What a Way To Go. Two of these musicals, The Band Wagon and It's Always Fair Weather, received Academy Award nominations and, along with On The Town, won the Screen Writers' Guild award. Singin' in the Rain was recently voted one of the ten best American films ever made and, by a vote of international film critics conducted by the prestigious magazine Sight and Sound, it was ranked third among the ten best films of all time. As performers, Comden and Green appeared in On the Town and later did an evening at the Golden Theatre, A Party With Betty Comden and Adolph Green, comprised of material from their own shows and movies, and from their act, The Revuers. In 1977 they did a new version of A Party to unanimous acclaim at the Morosco Theatre, and toured with it. A Party received an Obie Award when it was first performed. They are both members of the Council of the Dramatists Guild, have been elected to the Theatre Hall of Fame, and the Songwriters Hall of Fame, and have received the Mayor of New York's Certificate of Excellence. Ms. Comden received the Woman of the Year Award from the Alumni Association of New York University. She appeared in the films Garbo Talks and Slaves of New York, and on the stage in the Playwrights' Horizons production of Wendy Wasserstein's Isn't It Romantic? Mr. Green appeared in the films Simon, My Favorite Year, Garbo Talks, Lily In Love and I Want To Go Home.

Nacio Herb Brown (22 February 1896- 28 September 1964) was a United States songwriter. Brown was born as Ignacio Herb Brown in Deming, New Mexico. He graduated from the University of California, Los Angeles. He was a successful writer of popular songs, and Broadway theater music in the 1920s, originally doing this as a sideline to his financially successful career in California Real Estate. In 1928 he was hired to work in Hollywood by MGM and write movie music for the new medium of sound film. For his film work, he often collaborated with lyricist Arthur Freed. He appears in the film *The Hollywood Revue* of 1929. In the 1930s he was married to actress Anita Page. Brown's hits included "Fit as a Fiddle and Ready for Love", "Pagan Love Song", "Singin' in the Rain", "Wedding of the Painted Doll", and "You Are My Lucky Star". Nacio Herb Brown died in San Francisco, California. Brown is an inductee of the Songwriters Hall of Fame.He wrote the music for the musicals *Singin' In The Rain* and *Take A Chance* and additional music for *Big Deal* and Earl Caroll's *Vanities*.

Arthur Freed (September 9, 1894 - April 12, 1973) was born in Charleston, South Carolina. He was a lyricist and a Hollywood film producer. Freed began his career in vaudeville, and he appeared with the likes of the Marx Brothers. He soon began to write songs and was eventually hired by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer. For years, he wrote lyrics for numerous films. In 1939 he was promoted to the position of producer and helped elevate MGM as the studio of the musical. Freed choose to surround himself with film directors such as Vincente Minnelli and Busby Berkeley. He also helped shape the careers of stars like Judy Garland and Gene Kelly. His team of writers, directors, composers and stars came to be known as the "Freed Unit" and produced a steady stream of popular, critically acclaimed musicals that lasted until the late 1950s. Freed served as associate producer on *The Wizard Of Oz*. His most famous song is "Singin' in the Rain," and two of his films won the Academy Award for Best Picture. Those being, *An American In Paris* (1951) and *Gigi* (1958).

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
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
