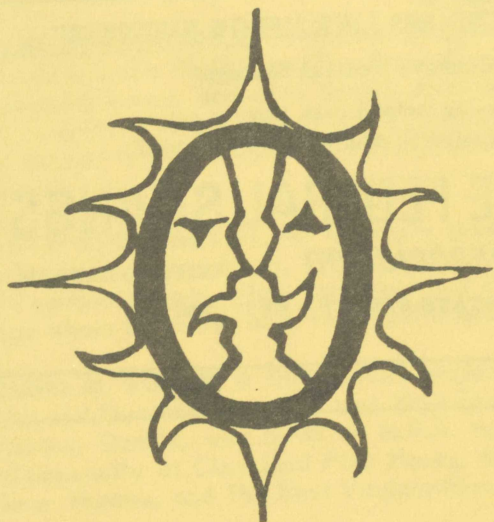

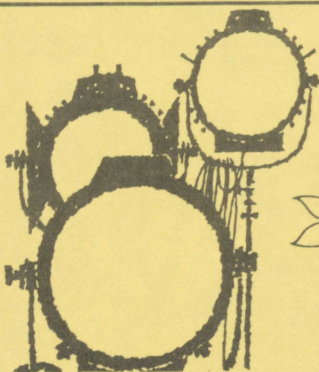

## DIRECTORS

**CHARLES W. DODRILL**, Director of Theatre at Otterbein since 1958, holds an M.A. from Kansas University and a Ph.D. from Ohio State. Dr. Dodrill is past president of national Theta Alpha Phi Theatre Honorary, and Ohio Speech Association and the current president of the Ohio Theatre Alliance. He is responsible for many innovations in Otterbein Theatre, including the "guest star" and summer theatre programs, and most recently the "professional intern" program for Otterbein seniors.

**MARTY BOOKWALTER**, an Otterbein graduate, joins the Summer Theatre staff as Designer/Technical Director. Marty, whose designs at Otterbein included *A Streetcar Named Desire* and last summer's *Come Blow Your Horn* and *Pinocchio*, recently returned from Washington's Arena Stage where he served as a Technical Intern.

**DENNIS M. ROMER**, a 1971 theatre graduate of Otterbein, joins the Summer Theatre as Guest Actor and Director. He will direct *Move Over, Mrs. Markham* and appear in the remaining four productions. Dennis, who holds an M.F.A. in Directing from Wayne State University, has worked professionally at Cleveland Play House, Meadow Brook Theatre, Parker Playhouse, Sea Ranch Dinner Theatre, and The West Virginia Historical Drama Association.

## DIRECTOR'S CORNER

As we conclude our 9th Summer Theatre season I begin to understand why the average life of most summer theatres is about 10 years! Producing six shows each summer in seven weeks is extremely demanding – the company day begins at approximately 9:30 a.m. and ends well after 11 p.m. At one point during the third week the company was presenting two shows daily and rehearsing two others. The stated purpose of the Summer Theatre is "to provide training and experience for students interested in pursuing careers in theatre while providing audiences with the best quality theatrical entertainment possible." Though the staff may occasionally wonder about the hours, apparently the concepts of the Otterbein Summer Theatre achieve some success for an increasing number of our students are working professionally and we are especially proud of our audiences (season ticket sale was the largest in our history). The theatre is a living thing that exists and flourishes only when mutual needs are met; actors, directors, playwrights and designers must create and interpret life, past and present, and without audiences that understand, appreciate and wish to share in this experience the theatre cannot exist. As you applaud our efforts we applaud your support and involvement. Thank you!

I would be remiss if appreciation were not expressed publicly to Otterbein College for providing facilities and support, to the Patrons for their continued vital monetary support which makes it possible for us to secure fine young talent for the company, to the individuals and stores who loaned props-furniture-costumes and to the area news media who provide invaluable support. Finally, I would also like to express appreciation to the staff members and company who have worked so hard to make the season a success.
