Sabbatical Outcomes

Worked to develop the MicroBooNE short-baseline neutrino experiment at Fermi National Accelerator lab for six weeks during the spring of 2014. This experiment is being installed and commissioned now, and taking data by this summer. Dr. Tagg created a system of software tools for doing online monitoring of the data acquisition systems, which will help ensure high-quality data for use in understanding neutrino-nuclear interactions at very high resolution. In addition, Dr. Tagg continued to develop the "Argo" online and offline event display software. This work was vital to the success of the multinational, multi-million-dollar neutrino experiment.
