Left on schedule. Everyone was where he was supposed to be. Helicopter ride from La Guardia to Kennedy airports over N. Y. at night was great. Flight time from Kennedy to Amsterdam was ~~7 hrs.~~ 7½ hours. time difference six hours. No sleep.

One of John Waters' logs was missing on arrival in Amsterdam. Claim was filed.

^W Oct. 30, 1970

Arrangements were made with Amsterdam Tourist Office for our free goodies and hotel with breakfast.

Free bus transportation to hotel was provided. Guide is Mr. Burny.

We checked in the Hans Brinker Stude Kerkstraat 136.

Afternoon free.

Six of the girls and I walked through downtown Amsterdam and took a canal tour of the city. Clear Temp 32° - little ice.

Dec 31, 1970

A full day - Breakfast
in the Hotel then a tour with
Mr. Burnley of the
Travel Bureau. Visits to
landmarks - Rembrandt's house,
restored windmill, H. Rotteman's
wooden shoe factory, Art Museum.
On our own from 1:15.

Group split up to see
Amsterdam in their own
way. Everyone seems to
love Amsterdam and they
are having a good time.
note - Just before midnight last
night, Carl Rose woke me
to come down to the Stetel Bar
to hear the wandering Spanish
Guitar Players. These 15-20

men are professional men
in Spain who tour Europe
on their vacation paying
for their own & have no
pay. Costumes are very
colorful. They took a liking
to our group and put on
a midnight performance
of dance, music and
merry making that was
great. Marilyn Swisher
recorded some.

F Jan. 1, 1970

Up and through the airport
check out for a 1:00 PM
flight to Frankfurt, Los
Palmas, Guatemala.

Weather was generally
clear. The Dutch were
great to us,

Los Palmas was cool
both in weather and
attitude. On leaving
the plane we were
herded into a fenced
in enclosure by Spanish
speaking attendants. 45 min
refueling stop and it
was long enough for
us.

Flight from Los Palmas

Jun 1

to Freetown Fugie Airport
was 3 hours. The heat and
swamp odor were almost
overpowering. We were
met at the airport by
O. Bangora and Max
Bailor. They keyed
us through passports
and customs. They
were needed.

Fona Waters small
bag did not arrive.
The same bag that was
late to Amsterdam
claim filed.

Airport bus broke
down about a mile
from the airport. Another
arrived in 45 mins for

the ferry across the river to Free Town another 30 min. Changed to a Froush Bay College Bus at Paramount Hotel.

Six men appeared out of the darkness and began grabbing our bags and asking for money. Not having money. I gave them a U.S. Dime and Dr. Bangora told me not to use U.S. money after that. We tipped them

Arrived at the dorms and signed in with Max Bailor. Mosquitoes were thick at 2:30 AM. Slept a little.

Jan 2, up at 6:00 AM.
Cold shower & shave.
Breakfast with some
business men from U.S.
who are touring West Africa
with John Akar.

killed in the political
situation. Food good.

Max Biler arrived
to take us to Barclays
bank to open an account.
one must be recommended
to be permitted to have an
account. It was a formal
visit to the asst manager
after filling out a paper
appointment form and
waiting just a little.

After polite conversation
with the recent arrival
from London. White man
and very proper. We were
accepted and completed
the forms. They took the
checks but must advise
us next week on the
amount of fees that
will be credited to the
account. It must be
computed on a business
day you know and this
is Saturday.

A.F.B.C. has took
the students to the
bank. Different bank
checks appeared to be

giving different rates
of exchange.

Max Balin took me
to a store to buy bug
spray and toured
further the Alhambra
became then a

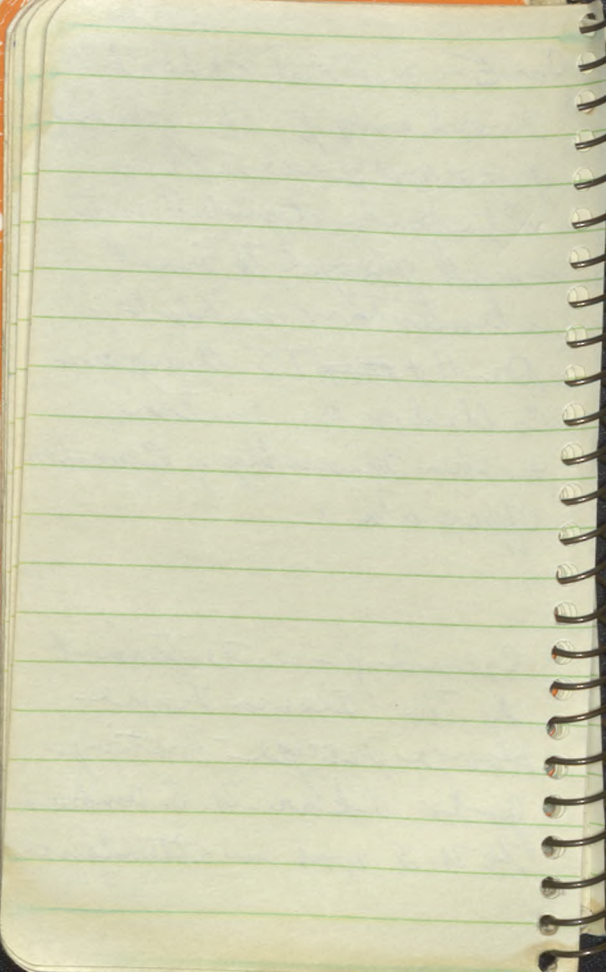

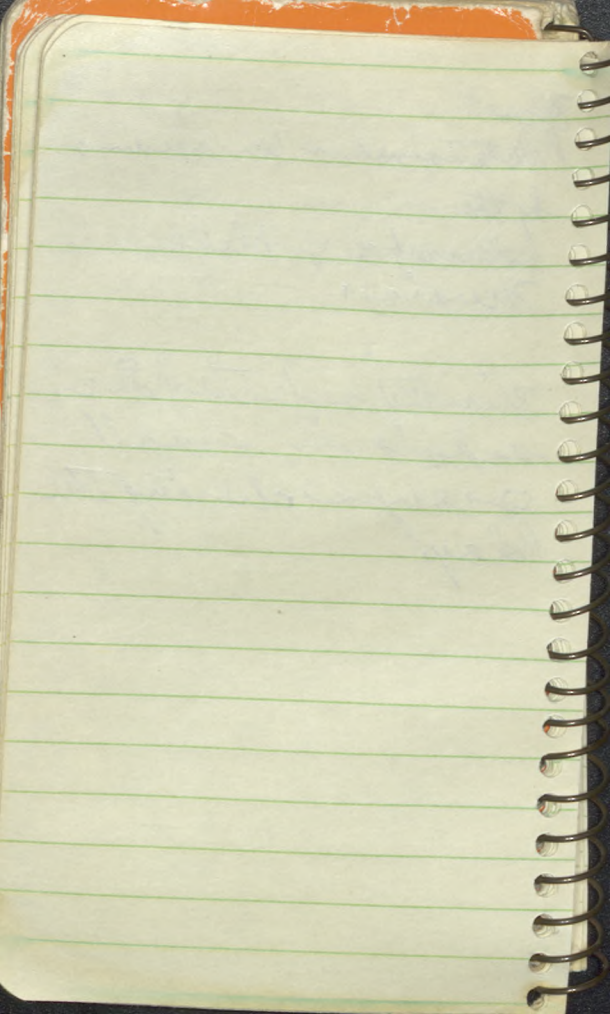

at 9:30. Met several
of the U. of Illinois
professors from the
College.

11 Jan. Mon.

Took the Ujala ~~students~~
students to the schools
to meet the headmaster.
We will use the glen.
schools at Peluwakun
Tambasa and the U.V.C
Experimental school

12 Jun. Tues.

Traveled by Land Rover
to Moyamba to check
on the students there,
all assignments are
made, and housing
is good at Hayford
school for the girls -
all five are sharing
a house, Earl Rossa
is living with a
teacher.

James Francis and
James Leopold are
living in the town
with a teacher from
England in ~~conditions~~
~~that are not so good~~

Jim Hopard has been
sick several days.
I gave him some
of the pink liquid
medicine and asked
them to call me if he
does not improve

Asked to rent a
surplus V. W. car
from Ujahn College.
Can't probably be
arranged.

13 Jan Wed.

Ill all day. Stayed
in bed most of the day.

Wm. Hodges came
by to invite me to his
house for a little
while. Found that
I worked with him
in my student teaching
in Winchester, Ind.
He has a son at Howel
Military School in
Indiana.

14 Jan. Thurs.

Verbal approval to
rent the college V.H.
will be available
probably Tuesday.

Worked on students
study proposals.

15 Jan. Fri.

Visited with regular
students about their
papers - topics & research.
Did library work.

16. Free day -
rested - wrote letters

17. Took all Njalo group
to Moyamba to church
in the E Y B mission
Pastor Ferguson
appreciated our being
there. Visited with the
Moyamba group and
ate our sandwiches
we had taken.

On the way home a
flat tire - driver refused
to stop until he had
ruined the rim. We
had a very poor driver.
In the 26th bus-van.
Thankful to be back safely.

17. Monday - arranged the
placements in Ngala Exper-
imental school for Carol
Carpenter & Jeanne Maxwell.

18 Supervisory visit to
Peleahachon school. Observed
the teaching of Elizabeth
Houston & Marilyn
Swisher. Both are
doing well - Marilyn
especially fine.

19. ^{Wed.} Started to Moyamba
but due to communica-
tions problem only got
to ~~Taiama~~ Taiama. Then
driver came back,
Re-scheduled for Thu.

20th Mar. Started to go to
Moyamba again - Trans-
portation says no vehicle
available - Waited to 8:30
then reported my plight
to Mr. Boampong - fin-
-ancial officer. He went
to the Transport office and
found a V. W. Bus. Had
a good trip. Visited
June Hartnault school
and checked on Lona
Waters, Susan O'Donnell,
and Wendy Roush, a
very good situation in
an almost new school.
Checked on Financial
arrangements with
Harford school. The Boys

secondary school will be
a separate account.

Saw all of the Moyamba
students and discussed
the papers with several.

Roads had several
police and military
checks. We were stopped
over each way. There
have been some attempts
to blow out the bridges
on the Freetown Road
during the past week.

The rental V. W. has
to be approved for my
use by the police and
military in Freetown.
It still is not available.
Arranged for the

Harford bus to bring
the Moyamba students
over on Fri, 28

22 - Friday

Moyamba for the week

transport. Hitchhiked to
Juction - no traffic.

Gave up and came back.

Hope of a car this week;
Birthday party for Dianne in
evening,
26 Jan. Tues.

Went to Zacama to
supervise Karen Schuske
and Dianne Miller

27 - Wed - Jan.

Supervisory visit with
Jeanne Maxwell and
Carol Carpenter in the
Experimental School.
Car is available but
not licensed - license
come in afternoon.

28 Thur. Jan.

Went to Moyamba in
the V. W. Good Trip
brought Jim Lopard,
Hively Dillon and
Susan O'Spinner back
with me for the weekend,
withdrew 100 £ from the Bank
at Moyamba.

29 Jan. Fri.

Students did Library work.
Jim Leopard attended the
Constitutional revision
meeting on campus. Dr.
Fitzjohn was in charge.

30 Jan. Sat. Went to
Makeni 80 miles
north of Nyala. Makeni
is a Temeni town known
for tie-dye cloth.
James Leopard, Susan
O'Donnell, Carol Carpenter
went with me in the V.W.
and returned with me Sat.
Karen Schabel, Dianne Miller
and Marilyn Swisher came
on a bus and spent the night

in the Pease-Coyne rest house.
31 Jan. Sun.

Rested. all students
returned by 3:00. Took
the Moyamba students
back to Moyamba in the
late afternoon - spent the
night with the
Wengers in Moyamba.

1 Feb. Monday -

Saw James Leonard, Jim
Francis, Wendy Roush,
Tara Waters & Sue O'Connell
back. Spent the night at
the Wengers' again.

7th Feb.

7 Feb. Saw Pierre
Savage, Shirley Dillon,
Earl Rosta and Fava
Waters teach.

Court for the Southern
Province is being held
in Moyamba. The
two firms are attending
when they can.

3 Feb. Wed.

Saw Carol Carpenter
teach, missed Jeanne
Moxwell as her teacher
taught through her
period.

transport problems took
Kam Schabel & Dianne

in epidemic stage at
Taisama.

Wendy Roush, Fava Waters,
Dione Sozage to Ujale.

6 Feb. Sat. Took the above
students to Makeni.

Moselen Feast Day
Spent the day Fri at Rtefunk
with the three girls

Celebrating Abraham's
sacrifice of Isaac - lamb.
Some shops were open and

trading was good. Return
to Moyamba and Ajala.
Very tired from over 200
miles of driving on rough
roads. Bad Lorry wreck
at Zaiama.

7 Feb, Sunday -

Started to Church but
change mind when I found
a big black smudge on
my white shirt,

3 students returned
from Kreetown, but Jeannet
Maxwell missed the transp-
ort and Karen Schafel
stayed with her to come
back together -

8 Feb - Mon. Observed
Marilyn Swisher & Elizabeth
Johnston at Peabody.
The girls come in from
Freeborn in the afternoon.
OK but tired - I was relieved
to see them. Had a confer-
ence with the six Njala
girls about their papers.

9 Feb, Tues. Observed
Jeanne Maxwell teaching.
Worked on research projects
Did library work.

10 Feb, Wed. -

Went to Moyamba.

(Metu - prof, BO)

Found that Shirley Dillon
and Sue O'Donnell had

gone to Bonthe last Sun,
and were not back. Placed
a tracer call on them.

Found that they had missed
a launch on Sunday, but
caught one Wed. morning.

They came to Kajala after I
returned about 5:30. I took them
on to Moyamba at night.

Observed Jim Francis
and Lou a Water truck,

11 Feb. Thur.

~~Stressed~~ Took Karen &
Dionne to Moyamba for Fri
trip to mines.

12 Feb. Thur. Took the other
four Nyala girls to Moyamba
and took Hayford bus to Sherbro
Rutile mine and the Bauxite
mine. Bus returned the
Nyala students. I spent
the night at Moyamba with
Jim Francis and Jim Legend.

Jim Francis, Diane Savage
and Lora Waters to Freetown.
Checked on tickets home - tickets
must be validated. Did
some shopping. Bought

Zone to Njala for dance.

They served us lunch.

Took group back to Moyamba
and returned to Njala -

not ill - Took her home.

petition Wesleyan to allow
her to stay at Njala for
the spring term.

next week.

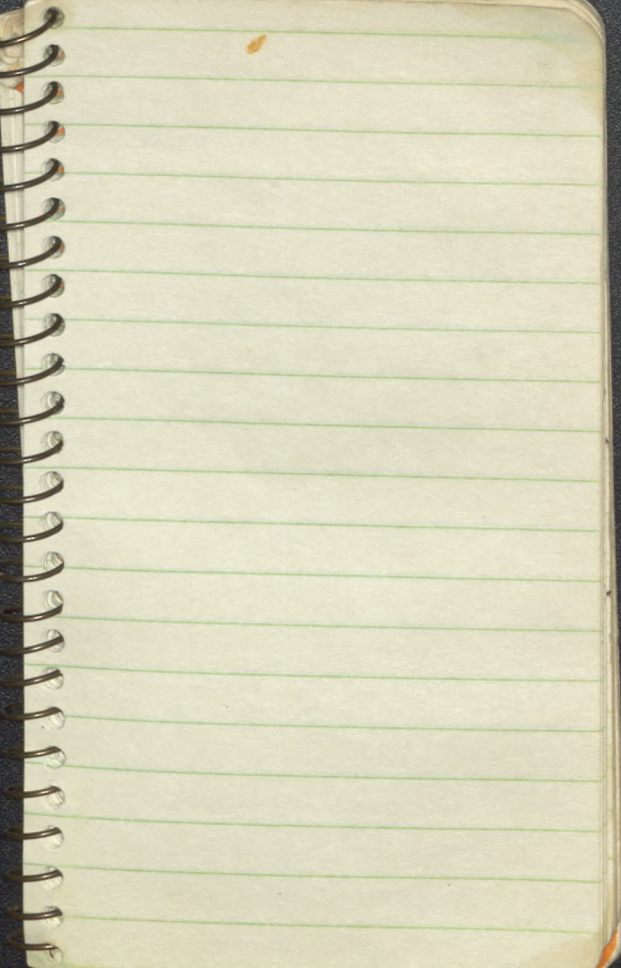
