A THEATRE WITH A PURPOSE

The Otterbein College Theatre will celebrate its 60th anniversary this year beginning with the fall production of *As You Like It*. *As You Like It* was originally produced at Otterbein in 1907 and initiated over half a century of annual productions on the campus.

This season, through our varied program, the Otterbein College Theatre will add to this already impressive record of theatrical activity, and strive to maintain its three-fold objective: ENTERTAINMENT, ARTISTIC AND CULTURAL APPRECIATION, AND EDUCATION — to both its spectators and participants.

In addition to four major productions and the film series, the theatre program this year will include a children's theatre production of *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*, a color travelogue, and the third season for its religious drama program which won national recognition this past year. The Theatre will also sponsor a National Invitational Readers' Theatre Festival on February 2, 3 and 4 as part of the sixtieth anniversary celebration.

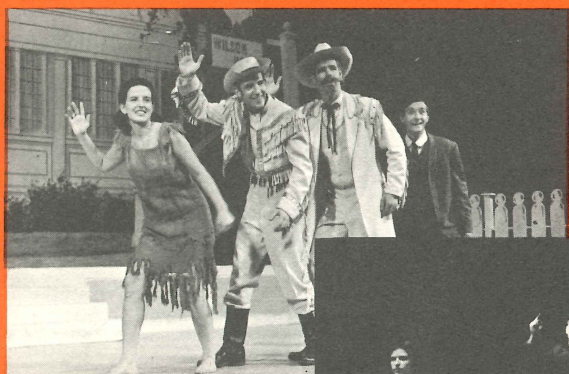

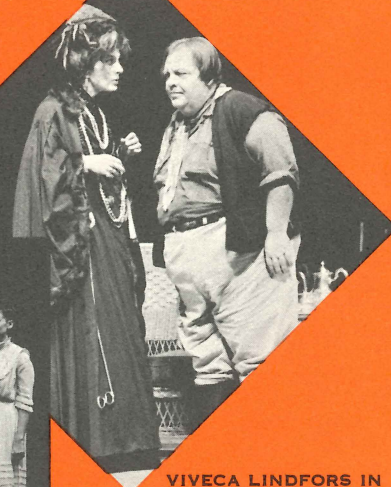
