

We will open our season with the delightful musical *1776*, a song-and-dance peek at the behind-the-scenes struggles through which the Declaration of Independence came into being.

In its first season, 1776 won two of theatre's most coveted awards, being designated "Season's Best Musical" by the New York Drama Critic's Circle and receiving the Tony Award as "Best Musical." Recently, it opened again for a limited run on Broadway.

The story features historical figures John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson and John Hancock but depicts them as flesh-and-blood men with a variety of strengths, problems and weaknesses. The show has fun with their bumblings, timidities, quirks of character and spiky arguments before they manage to agree on and sign the document that gave birth to our country.

Even though the outcome of the story is never in doubt, *1776* is consistently exciting and entertaining. This is a musical with style, humanity, wit and passion.

Molière is generally considered to have been the greatest comic dramatist of France and the author of the most brilliant comedies in theatrical history.


This farce about love and money is as entertaining as when it was first performed in 1688. It quickly gained favor and went on to become the most frequently performed of Molière's plays.

Meanwhile he tries to force his daughter into a marriage with a wealthy older man to avoid paying her dowry.

Moonchildren is a comedy/drama about being young in America in the late '60s when college students were embroiled in a world of rock music, peace marches, worries about the draft, exams and, like all generations before and after, love.

In the story, eight college students, five guys and three girls, live communally in an attic apartment.

They are a high-spirited, intelligent bunch of seniors, lurching awkwardly toward the dread day of graduation when their adult careers and responsibilities will begin. The spectre of nine-to-five jobs and houses-in-the-suburbs life that awaits them, plus the seeming irrelevance of their university courses gives them shivers of apprehension.

They respond to all this with a fusillade of witty jeers. They have become masters at hilarious put-ons — verbal virtuosos who compulsively victimize each other with wise-guy rituals and manic improvisation to mask their anxiety about the future and avoid real emotions.

A mood piece, *Moonchildren* creates with magical beauty the gentle, vulnerable and heartbreaking world of youth on the threshold of maturity.


