FOR PRESS, RADIO, TV

This football guide has been prepared for the benefit of press, radio and television in their coverage of the 1968 Otterbein College football team.

Memorial Stadium, home of the Cardinal gridders, is located on the edge of the campus on Center Street two blocks north of West Home Street. The stadium and adjoining bleachers seat 4000, and the two-tiered press box atop the stadium accomodates 30.

Space in the press box obviously is limited, and therefore should be requested by members of the media in advance of the game. This is particularly so for radio stations since all games are broadcast by the Otterbein campus station, and only one other station can be served in the press box.

Places for the sports information director and statisticians of the visiting schools are reserved each week. Requests for remaining space in the press box will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

The ever-popular Bob Agler "retired" from active grid coaching at his own request following the 1965 grid campaign but continues to devote full time responsibilities to his Athletic Director's role and classroom assignments — as well as coaching cross country and golf.

From the time Agler starred as a fullback for Otterbein until the present his name has been almost synonymous with Otterbein football. He returned to his alma mater in 1953 as a part-time assistant, was named head coach in 1955 and held the post for 11 years, departing with the best ever Otterbein coaching record of 57-36-4.

Agler earned an M.A. degree at Ohio State University, and has taken further advanced study at the same university toward a Ph.D. degree.

* * * * *

Beginning his third year as head football coach at Otterbein, Larry Lintner has high hopes of elevating the Cards to a better record than the identical 2-7 marks of the past two seasons.

He played under Bob Agler while a student at Otterbein and served as co-captain of the 1956 squad. Like Agler, Lintner was a hard running fullback and recognized as the stabilizer of the squad.

After graduating from Otterbein Coach Lintner was named head coach at Watkins Memorial High School (Pataskala) where he spent six years building an enviable record as a class "A" High School Coach.

For two seasons he worked closely with Agler as a member of the Otterbein football coaching staff. In 1965 Lintner earned an M.A. degree from Ohio University.

ATHLETIC STAFF

ELMER (BUD) YOEST End Coach

This marks the 13th year that Bud Yoest has served as an assistant Otterbein football coach.

Like Lintner, Yoest, too was a former Otterbein gridder (end) who returned to his alma mater shortly after graduation. Under Coach Lintner, Yoest has been working with the offensive ends, a familiar position for the veteran mentor since he played end in college.

After graduating from Otterbein in 1953, Yoest was on the staff at Mifflin High and returned to help Agler part-time in 1956. In 1958 he became a full time member of the department and was assigned the responsibilities of Head Track Coach.

DICK FISHBAUGH Tackle Coach

The newest full-time member of the Otterbein Athletic Dept. is Dick Fishbaugh who joined the Cardinal staff in 1966. He came to the Westerville campus from Reynoldsburg High where he was head basketball and assistant football coach.

Fishbaugh, a graduate of Ohio University, was an outstanding baseball player for the Bobcats. He also serves as head baseball and wrestling coach at Otterbein in addition to his duties as assistant football coach.

Working with Coach Lintner is nothing new to Fishbaugh. He served as assistant to Lintner when Lintner was enjoying success at Watkins Memorial.

DON (SKIP) HOOVLER Guard, Center Coach

Working with the Otterbein coaching staff as a part-time assistant, Don (Skip) Hoovler will give the guards and centers a varied sampling of high school, major college and professional football.

Hoovler played under Coach Lintner at Watkins Memorial High and went on to Ohio University where for three seasons ('62, '63, '64) he earned All-MAC honors.

During the past two years he was head coach at Olmsted Falls, and has also played with the New York Jets, Houston Oilers and Cincinnati Bengals of the AFL.

1968 OUTLOOK

"Although we've had a 2-7 record each of the past two seasons I definitely feel we improved as a football team last year, and with better team spirit and unity we should continue to improve this year."

This is the way Otterbein Coach Larry Lintner evaluated the '68 campaign prior to the start of his third year as head coach at his alma mater. He also was quick to add that continued improvement should reflect in the won-loss column.

Perhaps the biggest key to the hopes of Lintner for a successful season in '68 is held jointly by 11 seniors on the team (all lettermen within a total list of 27.) All the seniors have been starters in the past and should continue to see plenty of action this year.

Leading this crew will be tri-captains Ron Balconi, Dan Dent and Jeff Upp. A three-year regular as a line-backer, the 5-9, 190 Balconi from Sandusky once again should prove a demon to enemy ball carriers as he helps lead the defensive unit.

Working along side of Balconi on the defensive platoon will be middle guard Dan Dent, 6-0, 200 from Columbus (West). Dent was tabbed Most Improved Player on last year's team as he anchored the center of the Cards' defensive line.

The third tri-captain for '68 will be fullback Jeff Upp, 5-10, 190 from Lancaster. A halfback for three years, Upp also has good power and if he can remain injury-free could well fill the fullback spot left vacant by the graduated Paul Reiner. Last year's backup fullback, soph Steve Casto, is being switched to center.

Dave Widder who quarterbacked the Cards through most of '67 and set a bundle of passing records has graduated. However, senior Fritz Caudle (6-0, 175) who started during his freshman and sophomore years is back and should be free of a knee injury which hobbled him after last year's Heidelberg game.

Caudle could be pushed in the job of running Lintner's pro-I attack by soph Norm Lukey, one of four Canadians on the squad. Lukey hails from Toronto.

Also back seeking his fourth letter is tailback Steve Deringer (6-0, 190) who was the Cards' leading ground gainer last season (101 carries for 333 yards and a 3.3 average), and should be even better in '68. Deringer also grabbed 23 passes for 123 yards last year and had a 35.5 yard punting average.

Three experienced hands will be vying for the flanker spot. Leading the pack will be junior Doug Shackelford (5-11, 188). Shackelford grabbed 10 passes for 157 yards

in '67 but was saddled with injuries much of the year. Others in the running are sophs Tom Gilmore and Pete Parker.

Pre-season picks along the offensive line show record shattering Gary Moore back at split end. The glue-fingered, 6-2, 185 senior from Dayton (Wayne) established a new school mark for pass receptions last year with 31 good for 347 yards. Soph Ken Jackson should provide good back-up.

Tight end is a question mark since last year's regular and Most Valuable Freshman, Hollis Haff, has transferred to West Virginia U. Leading the list of returnees is sophomore Barry Walton (6-2, 185).

Filling out the offensive line should be junior Rich Rawlins (6-3, 235) and soph Lou Lord (6-3, 230) at tackles; senior Dan Neese (5-9, 210) and junior Deems Leasure (6-0, 196) at guards; and junior Steve Laek (6-2, 235) at center. All but Lord were regulars last year.

On defense the early outlook shows a pair of sophs, Keith Wakefield (5-10, 185) and Mike Hayward (6-2, 225) at end; Rawlins (who may go both ways) and senior J. D. Wilson (5-11, 220), a three-year starter at tackle.

The graduation of MVP Bill Baker leaves a big hole to fill at one linebacker. Tri-Captain Ron Balconi should fill one spot, but he is the only veteran with experience. Best of the returning upperclassmen is soph Ed Haffey (5-10, 210).

Four veterans are on hand to man the corner back and safety positions but will be pushed by a good crop of freshmen. The vets are seniors Dale Barr (5-8, 165) and Brian Bates (5-10, 165) at corner back, and senior Dick Augspurger (6-3, 195) and soph Craig Weaver (5-8, 175) at the safety posts.

Lintner is quick to admit that the Cardinals again face a most demanding schedule with outstanding opponents within the Ohio Conference such as last year's OC runnerup Muskingum, Baldwin-Wallace (whom Lintner rates a dark horse in this year's race), and always tough Capital, the Cards' arch rival.

Non-conference foes will not come any easier as Otterbein once again will face Ashland, a team that could be tops in Ohio this year; and an always rugged Ohio Northern eleven.

The Cardinals' opening opponent, Susquehanna (Pa.), is a newcomer to the schedule this season as are Ohio Northern and Baldwin-Wallace. They replace Indiana Central, Guilford and Ohio Wesleyan respectively.

SENIOR SKETCHES

DICK AUGSPURGER (6-3, 195, safety) – Improved immensely last season and earned a starter's role... height has been big asset in batting down opposition passes...pole vaulter on track team in the spring.

RON BALCONI (5-9, 190, linebacker) – A starter since his freshman year, Bal consistently leads the defensive unit in tackles...will help lead the Cards as tri-captain this year...one of three seniors from Sandusky.

DALE BARR (5-8, 165, safety) – One of the smallest members of the team but still a hard-nosed defender who has earned three varsity letters...maintaining a tradition of London High athletes who have gone on to Otterbein.

BRIAN BATES (5-10, 165, cornerback) – Two year letterman who gives the Cardinal secondary good strength and agility...a three year veteran of the wrestling team and captain of last year's mat squad.

FRITZ CAUDLE (6-0, 175, quarterback) – Started during his freshman and sophomore year but saw limited action in '67...a knee injury suffered against Heidelberg is not expected to give him any trouble this season.

DAN DENT (6-0, 200, middle guard) – Gained the nod as Most Improved Player last season after taking over tough middle guard post...another of this year's tri-captains...veteran catcher with baseball team.

STEVE DERINGER (6-0, 190, running back) – Leading rusher who averaged 3.3 yards in 101 carries last season and also scored four TD's...handled punting chores with a 35.5 average and also grabbed 23 passes for 123 yards.

GARY MOORE (6-2, 185, split end) – Really came into his own last year and set a new OC season record with 31 receptions despite a bothersome shoulder injury...brother of former halfback Jack Moore '65,

DAN NEESE (5-9, 210, guard) – Came back to regain his starting role last year after missing the '66 campaign...a steady performer who gained high school All American honors at Sandusky.

JEFF UPP (5-10, 190, fullback) – Being switched to fullback this year after three seasons at halfback...another tri-captain for this year...good speed has been utilized as sprinter with track team in off season.

J. D. WILSON (5-11, 220, tackle) – Versatile and very strong lineman who has played at both tackle and guard, and has seen both offensive and defensive duty...has also been a member of the varsity wrestling team.

The Cards' opener this fall finds them going against a first-ever foe in Susquehanna. Formerly a College Division power in the East, Susquehanna now has suffered through three straight losing seasons. The Crusaders were 1-8 in '67 and were drubbed by two OAC teams, Wittenberg (63-0) and Findlay (47-0).

Coach Jim Hazlett's hopes for improvements in 1968 rest primarily in a group of sophomores including end Whitney Gay and Bruce Bengston, tackles Tom Lyons and Joe Dambrocia, halfback Dennis Simmons, and fullback Joe Palchak. Finding a new quarterback (John Nanos has the early edge) and strengthening a weak pass defense will be the big problems.

OTTERBEIN'S FOOTBALL STORY

Records show that in 1889, Robert Spear, Princeton scholar and athlete, visited Otterbein and explained the game of football. The idea was a hit and a move was immediately started to provide football at Otterbein.

There was one major problem – there was no football! A student, Ernest S. Barnhard, raised \$4.00 to buy the first football and, thus, football at Otterbein was under-way.

In 1890, A. L. Artz, an old Dartmouth player, was hired to coach the first team which played two games. Kenyon was the first opponent, and they defeated the Otterbein team, 48-6. Denison won the second game, 14-0. The first Otterbein football victory was recorded in 1892 when the Cardinals defeated Ohio State University, 42-6.

As the years progressed, football at Otterbein did likewise. In fact, from 1890 to 1920, a total of 20 coaches served the football squads at Otterbein, and for four of those years, there wasn't a coach!

From 1920 until 1955, the Otterbein football team was directed by six different head coaches. M. A. Ditmer became the first coach to last more than three years. He was with the Otters seven years, from 1920-26. A. B. Sears took over for two years, 1927-28. R. K. (Deke) Edler served the team as head coach for six years (1929-34) leading into the reign of the late Harry Ewing.

Ewing started coaching in 1935 for the first of his three four-year stints. Following a three-year stay by S. T. (Sam) Selby, 1939-41, Ewing returned for another four-year coaching term during the lean war years of 1942-45.

During this time, when any opposition was hard to find, Ewing concentrated on service teams and compiled a four-year record of 16 wins, 7 losses and 3 ties, before yielding the coaching duties to ex-Ohio State gridder George Novotny.

Novotny's appointment as football coach at Otterbein came at the end of World War II (1946). That year he produced one of the greatest Otterbein teams ever, sporting a 7-1 record. The lone loss was a 13-7 setback against the University of West Virginia in the season opener. The fame of the '46 team sticks with the Cardinals to this day.

Ewing returned to the coaching scene for another four years after Novotny resigned in 1950. Known throughout Ohio as "Mr. Athletics at Otterbein," Ewing was guiding

the Otters for the third time. When he retired in 1955, he ended 12 years of football coaching at Otterbein and more than 20 years with the college's athletic teams.

Bob Agler who is now serving as Athletic Director, guided the Otters for 11 years until his retirement from coaching this past season. In his 11 years as head coach, he compiled an enviable record of 57-36-4, the best ever accumulated by an Otterbein coach.

Football at Otterbein really came into its own at Otterbein during the Agler era. After bouncing up and down during the first years of Agler's 11 year stint, the Cardinals compiled six consecutive winning seasons from 1959 through 1964.

Agler brought a new and exciting style of football to Otterbein influenced greatly by the three years he spent as a player in the professional ranks (two seasons with the Los Angeles Rams of the National Football League and one with the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League).

On the plus side and ranking with probably the most exciting game in Otterbein's modern football history was the come from behind 28-28 tie recorded by the Cards against Wittenberg at Springfield in 1963. This tie, which saw the Cards' quarterback, Dave Kull, complete a record 18 passes, came in the midst of Wittenberg's most successful string of seasons in the Ohio Conference.

Probably the most outstanding player to compete on the Otterbein grid teams coached by Bob Agler was quarterback Larry Cline who completed four seasons as the regular Card signal caller in 1960. Cline still holds three individual season records for the Cards and also one single game mark.

Cline's mark of 1080 yards passing and 23 touchdown passes thrown (both in 1960) still dot the OC records book as does the 1231 total yards gained in 1959. In the single game category Cline still claims the most touchdown passes thrown (six against Capital in 1960), and the most total yardage (246 against Hiram in 1959).

Other top gridgers of the "Agler Era" included Glenn Aidt, Gary Allen, Dick Amelung, Bill Baker, Jim Earnest, Ron Jones, Gene Kidwell, Harry Klockner, Dave Kull, Bill Messmer, Jack Pietila, Dick Reynolds, Gary Reynolds, Jack Spicer, Jim Wacker, and Jerry Whitacre.

Following the 1965 season, Agler's aide, Larry Lintner was named to replace him in the head grid post. Lintner, a former player under Agler, established himself in the high school ranks as a winning coach for six seasons at nearby Watkins Memorial.
