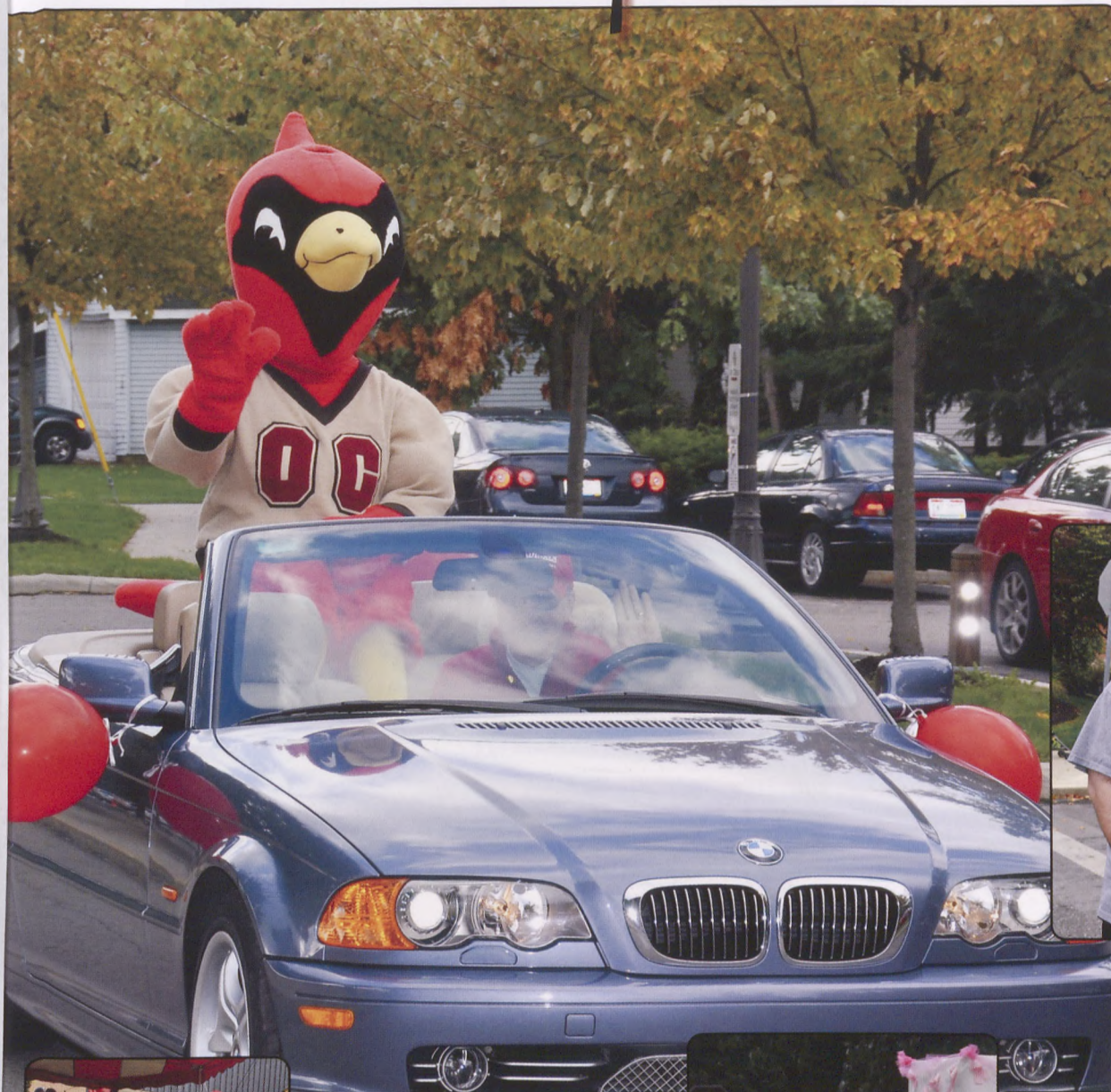

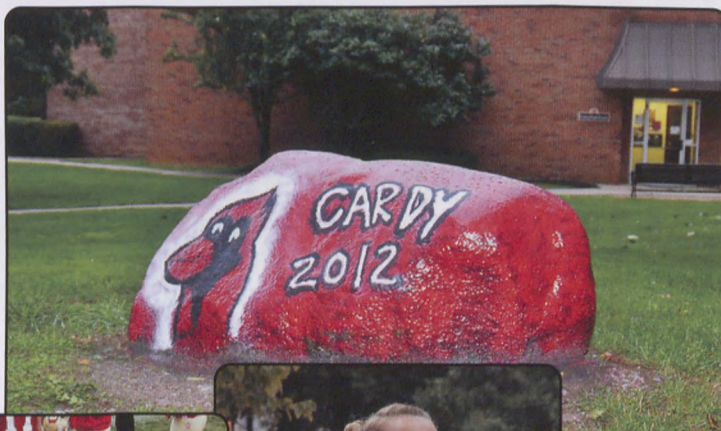

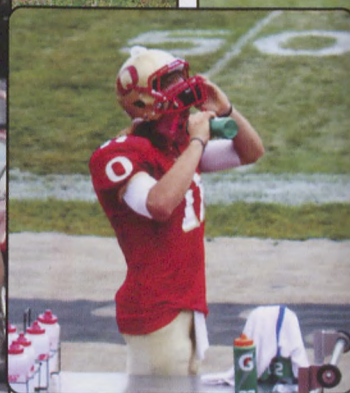

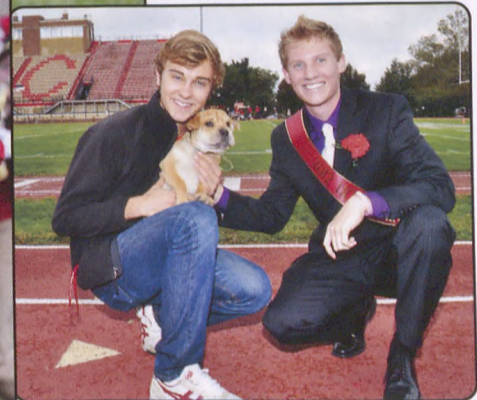

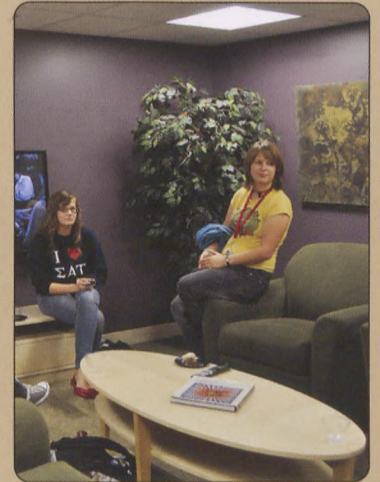

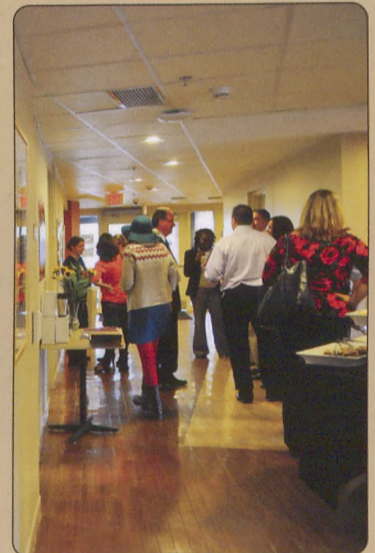

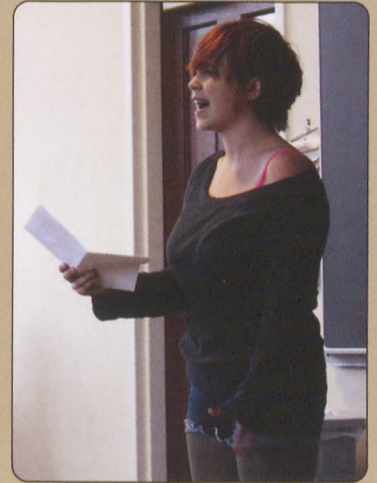
One Billion Rising

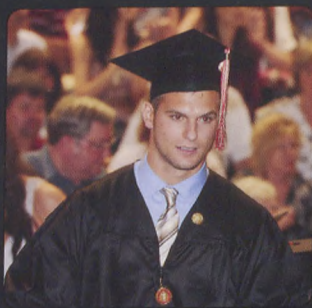


MARCHING BAND

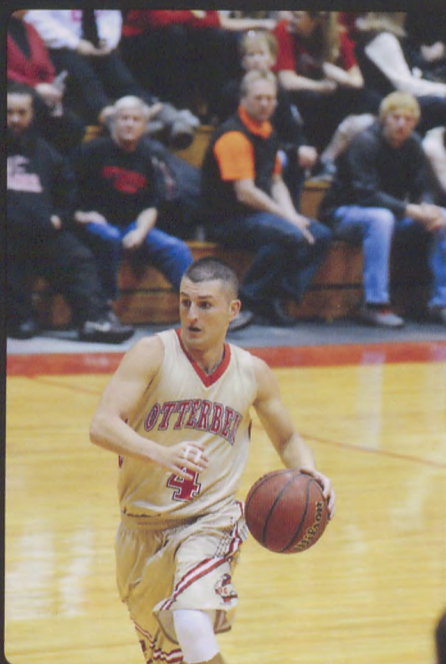

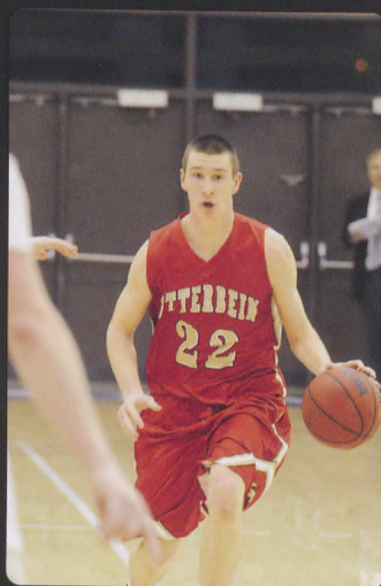

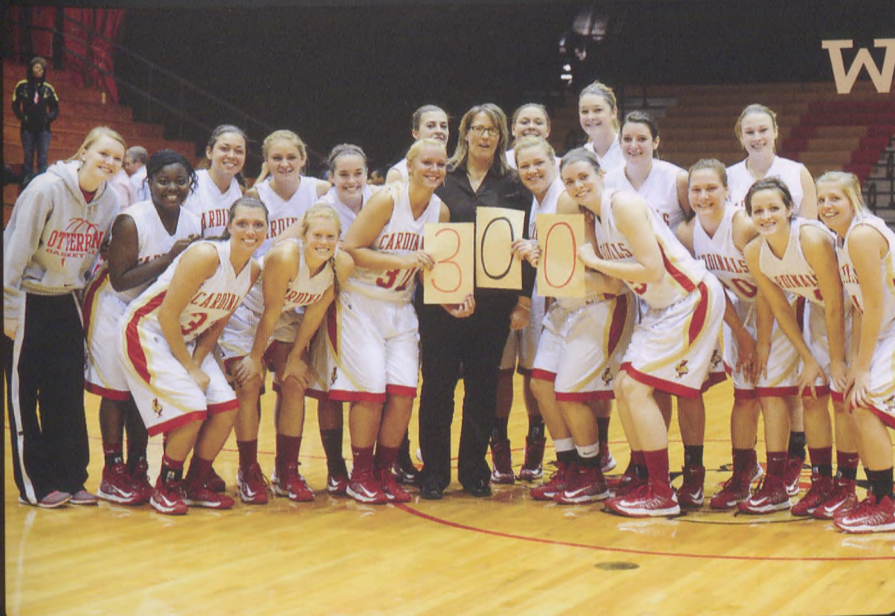
