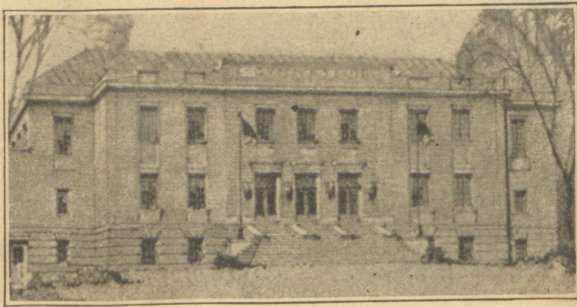

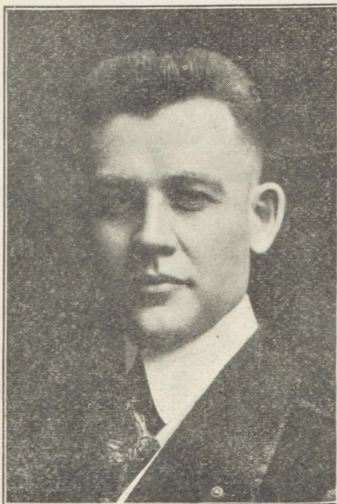

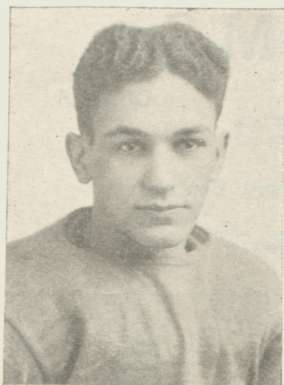

## Common Penalties

### Loss of 5 Yards

Failure of substitute to report.  
Violation of off-side rule.  
Illegal positions.  
Unreasonable delay.  
Holding, etc., by defense side.

### Loss of 15 Yards

Time called more than four times during a half at request of captain.

Throwing forward pass to ground prior to fourth down.

Substitute communicating with player before ball is put in play.

Holding, etc., by side in possession of the ball.

Tripping, tackling out of bounds, running into opponents, clipping, etc.

Offensive player pushing or pulling player carrying ball.

Deliberately roughing the kicker after he has kicked.

### Loss of 25 Yards

Team not ready to play at start of second half.

### Loss of Half Distance to Goal Line

Player disqualified for striking, kneeling, kicking, etc.

### Loss of a Down

Interference by side making forward pass—prior to fourth down.

Illegal or incomplete forward pass—prior to fourth down.

### Loss of Ball

Batting the ball.

Illegal use of hand or arms.

Interference by side making forward pass—fourth down.

Illegal or incomplete forward pass on fourth down.

Failure to advance ball in four downs.

### Disqualification

Striking, kneeling, kicking, etc.

# A Reiteration of Our Crying Need

A letter from President Clippinger.

To the Alumni and Friends of Otterbein:

The securing of a new gymnasium is no idle dream of visionary alumni. It is an actual necessity and must be realized. The college authorities are in dead earnest and are determined to persist until the building is secured.

The needs are too obvious to require a recital of them, yet here they are:

- (1) The floor space and the playing space of the present building are wholly inadequate. The playing floor should be not less than 50x80 ft. with wide margins in addition. Ours is 31x60 ft. and outside measurements are only 52x64 ft. The size is cramped and dangerous for players.
- (2) The seating space is too small. It is uncomfortable and dangerous. It accommodates 250 and should provide for 1500.
- (3) We are limited in showers, locker rooms, quarters for visiting teams, hand ball courts, stock and storage rooms, offices and small exercise rooms. All these should be provided in a new building.
- (4) Rooms or display cases should be provided for trophies and other valuable treasures for the athletic association.
- (5) A running track and a swimming pool are desirable additions. While not essential now, they should be included as a part of the development plans.

The records of the past are the hope of the future. For years the college was in need of a women's dormitory. Through the generosity of Mrs. Sarah B. Cochran, a fine building was secured. There was equal need of a library, and Mr. Andrew Carnegie made it possible. Later, a long-felt need for a building for music and art was met by Mr. George Lambert and family who provided the money. A central heating plant was needed, and half a dozen friends built it. For many years the college was embarrassed for want of a modern science building, and a portion of the gifts of seven thousand friends was used for its construction.

One of the most pressing needs of the college now is an adequate modern gymnasium. The college authorities have faith to believe that the alumni will stand by their own project. There is no other source of help. Because of other pressing interests, the doors of the churches are closed for the present.

The immediate need is for \$75,000 for the first unit of the gymnasium. Work will begin as soon as the money is secured. Later, the complete structure for \$200,000 will be furnished.

There are over 1400 living alumni. An average of \$55.00 each will make this building possible. Add \$10.00 each for improvements to the old gymnasium and the task is accomplished.

Already two alumni have pledged \$1000 each and two \$500 each. Other substantial pledges are pending. Payments on pledges are being made promptly. Let's push it across the line.
