February 14 - 1910

Dear Lucinda Dear Sister I have
been out in the cold all day, can
hardly write at all Mildred and
William have been to school have ^{returned}
Blanch and Margaret are still in
Chicago Margaret is improving
Orla is with them, Ma & I we
are keeping house, all ^{our} ourselves
we have been quite well all
winter we have had a long
cold time of it ever since
December the snow is about
8 inches deep now good sleighing
at this time I thought we should
have an opportunity to visit you
before this time, we expected to ^{come} home
last fall at fair time, on account
of Margaret's illness has been so
we could not get away

Tell the Dr if he was here I would
ask him for a big dose of Calomel
at his time Tell the boys I think
of them often would be so glad
to see them. If Rose & children
and the School Mair she
knows full well that we want
to see her and Blanche B
Please give our love to all
I write soon
