All My Sons hits the Campus Center stage

The 1947 Pulitzer Prize winning play *All My Sons* opens January 27.

The play was written by Arthur Miller one year prior to *Death of a Salesman*. The drama goes along with the I.S. Festival theme of the American Dream and is just under two hours long.

Dennis Romer, an assistant professor of theater and artistic director, is director of

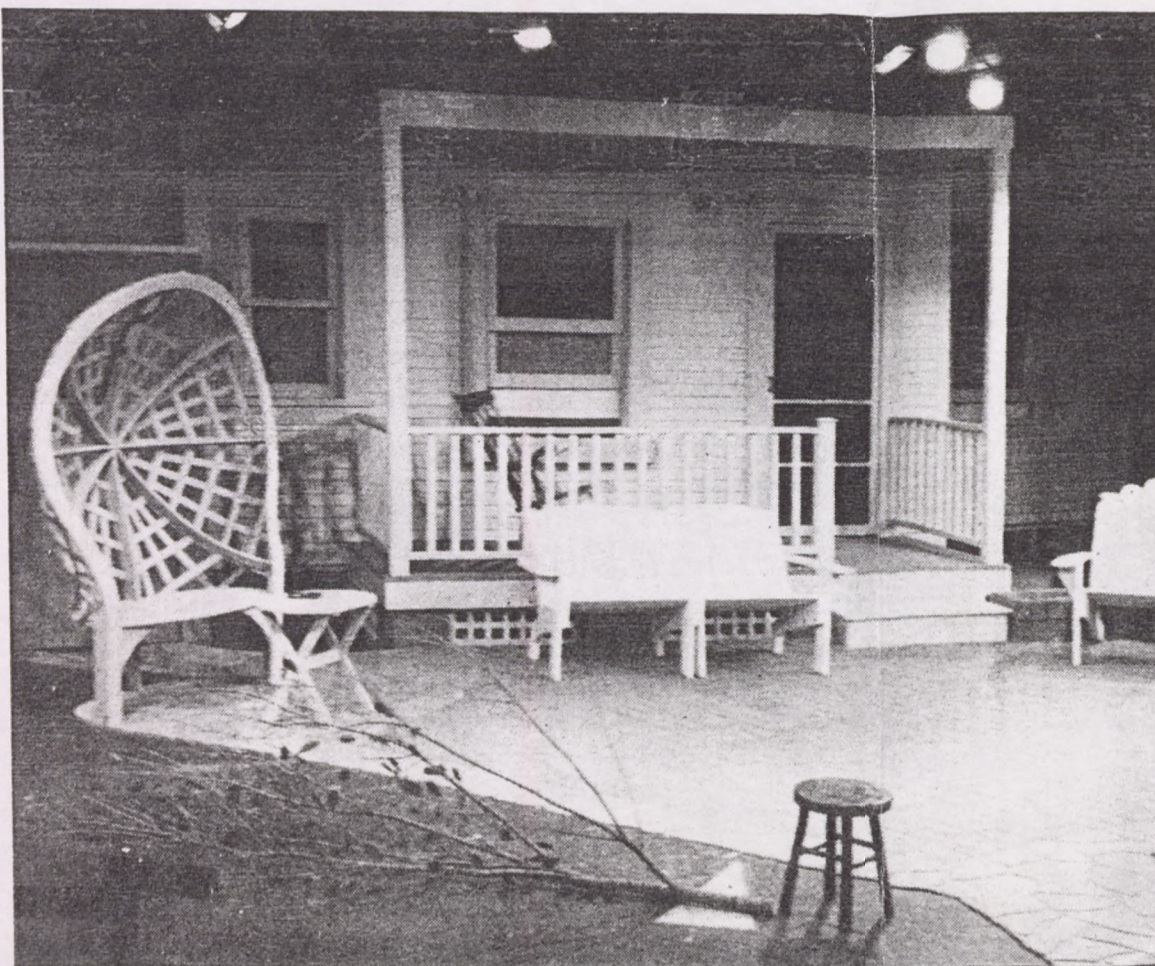
the play. He said, "It's the kind of play we don't do that often. It's the kind of play I think students will get into."

Romer said the play is about a man named Joe Keller who makes a bad decision and how it affects him and his family. The main question is whether family concerns are more important than

other responsibilities.

Romer said the play is well-acted and will provide a meaningful evening.

All My Sons runs from January 27-31 and February 3-7.

'All My Sons' opens at Otterbein Theatre

Otterbein College Theatre will open the new year with "All My Sons," the first successful show for Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright Arthur Miller.

"This story remains timely even though it was written in 1947," said artistic director Dennis Romer, who will direct the drama.

"This play closely follows the structure of Greek tragedy. In Greek tragedy, the hero was a god, but in Miller's view, that kind of tragedy could still exist with the common man.

"The central character, Joe Keller, is that good man with good intentions who makes a tragic mistake that comes back to him," Romer said.

"All My Sons" will be performed Jan. 27 through 31 and Feb. 3 through 7. All performances will be held in Campus Center Theatre, 100 W. Home St.

The drama centers on industrialist Joe Keller, who chooses to put family responsibility ahead of his responsibility to society.

Keller, the owner of an airplane parts plant, knowingly sold the Army defec-

tive parts which led to the deaths of 21 pilots during the war. He then allowed his innocent partner to go to prison for his crime.

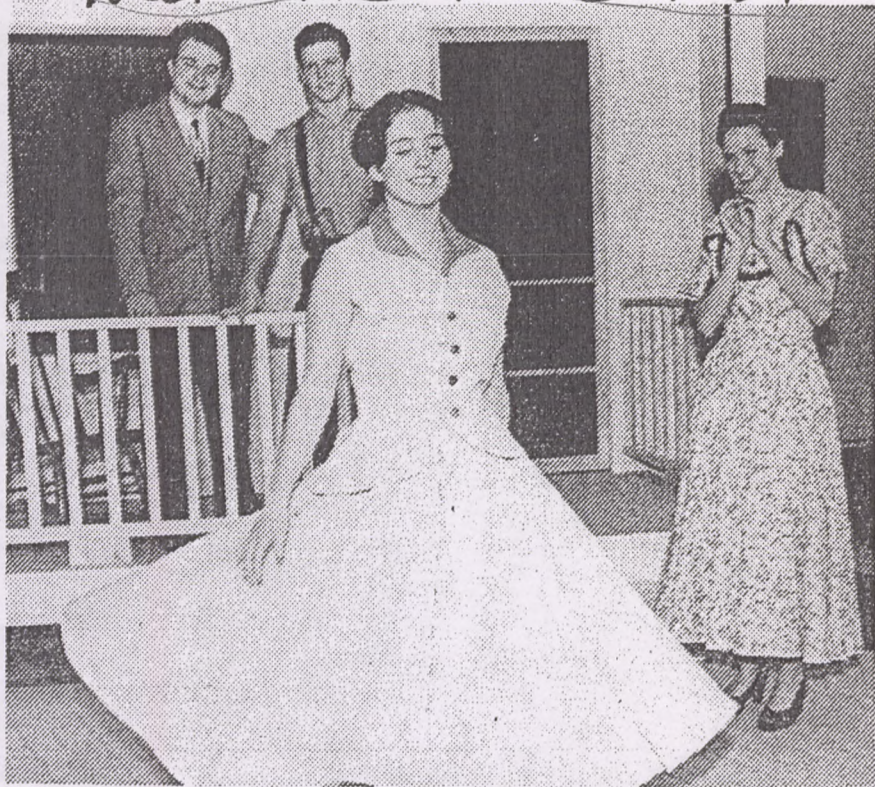
Keller's own pilot son, Larry, had been engaged to marry his jailed partner's daughter, but has been missing in China for more than three years. His other son, Chris, has returned from the war and wants to believe in his father's innocence but must reassess the facts as he falls in love with his missing brother's fiancée.

When "All My Sons" premiered in 1947, it won the New York Drama Critic's Circle as best play of its season.

The opening night show begins at 7:30 p.m. Other evening performances begin at 8 p.m. and Sunday matinees are at 2 p.m.

Tickets are \$9 for Friday and Saturday shows and \$7.50 for performances on Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday.

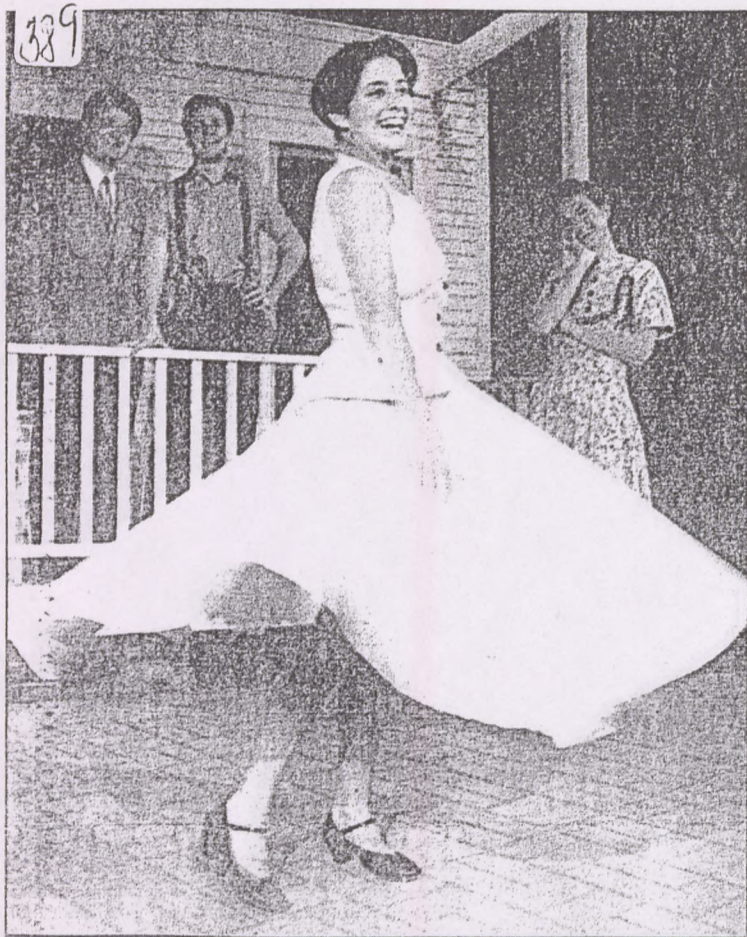
