OLD MOE ADMITS HE'S SCARED

Red, Otters Face Toughies

Politicians are not the only ones running scared these days.

Coach Moe Agler at Otterbein openly admits it while Glenn Fraser at Ohio Wesleyan and Keith Piper at Denison probably are keeping the nerve medicine and worry pills close at hand.

Otterbein, Wesleyan and the Big Red return to home gridirons Saturday against Ohio Conference competition.

OTTERBEIN tackles Hiram under the Memorial Stadium lights. The two teams have identical records, 2-1. Denison, forced to the limit to shake off Wooster last week, entertains Mt. Union, whose 7-6 loss to Muskingum makes the Raiders' 0-3 record a real fooler. Wesleyan meets Oberlin. Neither has won a conference game.

For the Otters and Denison it is a case of survival in the league title chase. For Wesleyan it's simply a search

from crumbs to ease the Pangs of starvation.

Hiram's 30-0 win over Ohio Wesleyan, highlighted by the great running of Halfback

Eric Thompson and the passing of John Ferrara, convinced Agler that the Otters are "facing a mighty tough club, one that could give us

all we want and then some. I just hope our team and fans realize this."

OF COURSE Agler is not yet climbing the water tower for an end-it-all leap. His Otters came up with a running rout that all but strangled Oberlin. Bill Messmer and Harry Klockner were the chief punishers of the Yeoman defense.

However Agler was jolted by bad news Tuesday night when he learned his ace freshman guard, John Chick-erneo, of Warren, will be lost for the season with injuries, and that two starters, Doug Franklin, defensive end, and Don Eppert, a tackle, are both nursing hurts serious enough to keep them sidelined Saturday.

Denison needed a 21-yard field goal by Jack A. Wilson of Reynoldsburg to beat off stubborn Wooster. Mt. Union extended Muskingum the full route and then lost it in the final seconds when a two-point conversion try failed.

Wesleyan was steamrollered by the new-look Terriers at Hiram; Thompson's outside running, Ferrara's aeriels and Bill Woodson's line lashing was far too much for the Bishops.

THE COLUMBUS area's other Ohio Conference member unbeaten Capital (3-0) takes it walking wounded to Springfield Saturday to do combat with Wittenberg's defending Tigers, who have devoured four opponents, three in the conference.
