

# OU's Hess Is Happy After Edging Miami

Miami University's first loss of the year to Ohio University 23-22 Saturday meant something to OU Coach Bill Hess.

After the Mid-American

Conference match, a jubilant Hess called the victory one of his finest at Ohio University.

It was not necessarily because Miami had been handed its first defeat of the sea-

son, but that Hess had received his 75th triumph at OU.

"I WAS real proud of our team," Hess said. "We've come back from two big losses to win the last two games." He was especially pleased with his quarterback, Steve Skiver, and his defense.

"Steve really laid them in there when he had to," Hess said. Skiver connected on passes of 10, 42 and 61 yards for three TDs. The two longer passes were to split end Bob Allen.

"OUR DEFENSE," said Hess, "was missing five regulars in the second half, yet we did a great job." He singled out defensive back Vic Papushak, who had two interceptions in the game.

Miami, now 4-1, scored all its points in the third quarter. Quarterback Jim Bengala threw two TD passes and back Kim Fortney swept right end for 43 yards for the Redskins third touchdown.
