



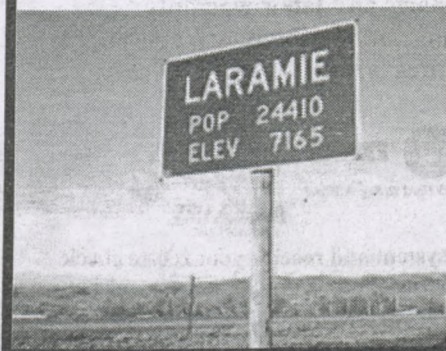

The Laramie Project, written by Moises Kaufman and members of the Tectonic Theatre Co., will run Thursday through Sunday and May 7-10 in the Campus Center Theatre, 100 W. Home St.

Kaufman and members of the theater project made six trips to Laramie, Wyo., after the death of 21-year-old Matthew Shepard, a student at the University of Wyoming, during the trial of two

men accused of killing Shepard and conducted more than 200 interviews to create the theatrical collage.

Director is Dennis Romer, scenic and lighting design is by Rob Johnson.

Performance times are 7:30 p.m. Thursday, 2 p.m. Sunday and 8 p.m. for all other performances.
