Both teams will enter the game with the same record, each having lost its initial outing of the season. Kent State turned back the Mounts, 18-0, while the Otters were soundly trounced by Denison, 38-7.

Novotny says he'll probably start the same eleven Saturday that took the field against Denison. This will put Gene Clark and Ray Chadwell at the ends; Dart Keech and Junior Miller, tackles; Chuck Hardin and Charlie Neikirk at the guard positions and Buz Farmer at the snap back slot.

In the backfield will be Bob Long, quarterback; Kenny Zarbaugh and Bert Bailey, left and right halves, respectively, and Dick Housum at fullback. Zarbaugh, a Groveport grad, averaged seven yards by rushing last week and completed half of his passes.

The Otters will have more at stake than just winning their 17th consecutive home victory. They'll be playing in their brand new \$80,000 stadium.

The stadium will seat 1680. All seats are located between the 40-yard lines.
