OHIO COLLEGE SCENE

Sophomores Gain Big Spotlight

A band of talented sophomores took the spotlight in Saturday's Ohio college football action.

The real sophomore show occurred Saturday night at Akron where the Zips' 190-pound fullback, George Deo, smashed his way to four touchdowns as Akron rolled over Ohio Wesleyan 32-21. The six-footer from Hillsdale, N.J., played service football before enrolling at Akron. He won a letter last year but did not score.

Deo's performance upped his point production for the season to 42—just one point behind the state scoring leader, Alan Spiegelberg of Oberlin.

The versatile Oberlin junior racked up 14 points—on touchdown, two field goals and two extra points—in the Yeomen's 26-7 win over Carnegie Tech.

In third place in the tight statewide scoring race is Findlay's Ted Lanear who has 40 points to his credit. The freshman from Troy scored 10 points as the Oilers took over the lead in the mid-Ohio League on a 22-0 win over Ohio Northern.

Another sophomore, Otterbein's Dave Kull, tossed three touchdown passes as the

Cardinals crushed Kenyon 35-0. The Worthington youth completed 9 of 14 tosses before being relieved.

Otterbein shares the Ohio Conference lead with Wooster, Muskingum and Wittenberg. All posted loop victories Saturday to run their marks to 2-0.

Bowling Green, winners of the 1959 mid-American Conference crown and runner-up to Ohio U. last season, is making a strong bid to win it again this year. The Falcons have been unscored upon in two loop games, defeating Western Michigan 21-0 last week and crushing Marshall 40-0 in their opener.

Miami, which has won more Mid-AM football titles than any other team, finally figured out how to score touchdowns. The Redskins had been able to only kick field goals in their first three games but ran over three Tds last week in their 21-0 conquest of Kent State.

In another big one, Xavier won the mythical Queen City championship, defeating cross-town rival Cincinnati 17-12.
