# Otters Lose Moore; OWW Ace Retires

Otterbein's regular right halfback, Jack Moore, will be sidelined from four to six weeks with a split, fractured finger suffered in practice Tuesday afternoon.

Moore, a junior from Wayne Township High near Dayton, had played in the Otters' win over North Central, Ill., and in the tie with Wittenberg. The broken digit is on his right hand and required hospital treatment.

Coach Bob Agler said he would shift Dick Amelung, who had been spelling regular fullback Bill Thompson during the latter's injury, to Moore's halfback spot. Thompson has recovered and is ready for full duty.

AT DELAWARE Wednesday it was announced that Ohio Wesleyan's passing star, Jere Crosby, had quit football because of recurrent injuries. The Bellevue three-letter winner suffered a fractured jaw and required surgery in 1961. Last season he set a new Wesleyan passing mark with 1187 yards.

In pre-season drills this year Crosby sustained a knee injury and has seen little in service. And the Bishops' switch from the T to single wing has put sophomore Ed Curreri in Crosby's backfield spot. In two games Curreri has gained 255 yards rushing and passed for 27.
