

# OU-Kent St. Clash Opens MAC Chase

Ohio University and Kent State open the Mid-American Conference season in a 1:30 p.m. Saturday meeting at Kent, while Kenyon and Otterbein help kick off the lid in the Ohio Conference title chase during an 8 p.m. get-together in Westerville.

They're two of 18 games Saturday involving Buckeye collegiate aggregations as the 1970 Ohio college football season blossoms forth to a greater degree after an initial six-game card last weekend.

What has been advertised as college football's first doubleheader takes place in Cincinnati's new Riverfront Stadium when Miami University squares off against Xavier at 4:30 p.m. followed by a 7:30

p.m. Dayton-Cincinnati skirmish.

The Ohio U.-Kent State game is the only MAC contest this weekend. The only other Ohio Conference game sends Ohio Wesleyan to Heidelberg for an 8 p.m. test.

**TOLEDO** and Bowling Green both have non-conference road games on their Saturday schedules. The UT Rockets are at Buffalo seeking their 13th consecutive victory over the past two seasons and the BeeGees are in Logan, Utah, against Utah State.

Toledo, the defending Mid-Am champ, opened with a solid 35-2 win over East Carolina last week. Bowling Green may be without highly-touted sophomore running back Julius Livas (knee ligaments) against the Utes.

Denison and Marietta, coming off fine 1969 seasons, also get started Saturday against intersectional foes. The Big Red, 7-2 a year ago, is at Centre (Ky.) College and Marietta (8-1) hosts Westminster, Pa. under the lights.

**AL CHRISTOPHER** sends his first Muskingum College

football team against West Liberty (W. Va.) State at 8 p.m. in New Concord. Capital University opens its season a week hence.

Ohio University opened its 1969 season with a solid 35-0 whacking of Kent and holds a 14-7-1 series edge. Kent's last win in the series was by a 27-10 margin in 1965.

The Kenyon-Otterbein clash features the passing of senior quarterbacks Bill Christen (Kenyon) and Norm Lukey (Otterbein), along with Robert (Moe) Agler's return to sidelines as the Otter's head coach. Kenyon was 6-3 and Otterbein 3-5-1 last season.
