Otterbein Plays Hiram In Ohio College Grid Feature

Ohio Colleges fly into the thick of things for good Saturday with a slate of 22 football games.

Only attraction in central Ohio will be the Hiram-at-Otterbein game in Westerville, starting at 1:30 p.m.

Otterbein launched its season last week against Ohio Wesleyan, taking a 53-6 defeat, while Hiram was trimmed by Wooster 28-14.

Al Pesek, former Capital player and later coach at Bucyrus, is now coaching the Hiram team, and he has a big, slow squad on hand.

Otterbein's small squad (small in number and small in size) is featured by the running of Jim Barckhoff, former Gahanna star.

"Hiram is too big for my little boys to try and run through, and our passing hasn't shown anything spectacular, so I guess we'll have to try and run around them," commented Coach Harry Ewing of Otterbein.

BIGGEST GAME Saturday sends Ohio Wesleyan into a night game at Tiffin against Heidelberg, with the winner favored to become a contender for the Ohio Conference title. Denison is also one of the favorites, along with Wooster.

And Denison holds the key to the situation because it plays both Wesleyan and Wooster, on successive week-ends.

Wesleyan may not have Bill Shepler, a guard, or Jim Boggs, a halfback, ready for Heidelberg

Heidelberg, which is listed on the schedule in Capital's training room as Yackey, has been one of the top Ohio Conference teams ever since Paul Hoerneman became coach. He has Paul Yackey, former Dover boy, who led the nation in scoring last year. If Wesleyan's big team can stop Yackey, it can beat Heidelberg.

CAPITAL GOES to Wilmington for its opening game, also a night affair. The Quakers have what is expected to be a strong team despite the loss of John Lewis, tackle from North Lewisburg, who broke an arm in last Saturday's scrimmage.

Capital's lineup will probably be: Jim Congrove of East and Bob Kavanaugh of North at ends; Lou Cunningham and Chuck Graves, both of East, at tackles; Tim Riley of Aquinas and Loren Beck of East at guards; Ronnie Mauler of Hamilton Township, center; Jack Cherrington of East, quarterback; Ronnie James of West and Bruce McGinnis of Pittsburgh at halfback; and either Roy Guenburg or Dick Fisher of Hilliard at full.

Bill Butts, from Reynoldsburg, will be Wilmington's safety man.

OBERLIN WILL open its season at Meadville, Pa., opposing Allegheny, now coached by Dave Henderson, who just resigned at Kenyon. Jim Pohlman of Bexley and John Palmer, North, are

Columbus boys with the Oberlin team.

WOOSTER takes to the road for its next two games, going to Ada Saturday night for a game against Ohio Northern, and then playing at Kenyon the following week.

DENISON GOES to Washington, Pa., Saturday for a game against Washington & Jefferson, and Coach Jack Carl is still not "satisfied" with the showing of the Big Red in practice. It's the line which worries Carl the most.

BYRON HOLLINGER unveils his new Cedarville team at 1:30 p.m. Saturday when it hosts Alma, of Michigan. This is Hollinger's first term as head coach, and he figures the team should cut more of a figure in Mid-Ohio play than it has in the past.

Competition has been keen for starting assignments and the young team will be featured by the play of Dick Syrek, all-league halfback, and Ed Kurs, guard, co-captains, plus Joe McGuire, a transfer from Cincinnati, and John Spichty, all-league veteran.
