

# Cap And Dagger Lists Productions; Two Plays Scheduled This Week

"Winterset," Cap and Dagger's first production of the year, is in the final stages of rehearsal. The Homecoming Play will be presented at 8:15 p. m., Friday and Saturday, in Cowan Hall.

Directed by Professor Marion Chase and student assistant Mary Lou Poorman, the play will feature Lloyd Lewis and Dottie Miles in leading roles. Technical direction is in the hands of Bob Dunham and Ken Kohn is stage manager.

Plans for Cap and Dagger also include a tea, Monday, for the Barter Theatre Group of Abingdon, Virginia. Barter Theatre will present Shakespeare's "The Merchant of Venice" at 8:15 p.m. Monday in Cowan.

The dramatics society will sponsor a program of varied entertainment for the 1952-53 theatre season. The plays will be directed by Professor Chase or, in the case of the one-act plays, by members of Cap and Dagger. An innovation in the program is introduced by the cooperation of the Music and Speech Departments in the major production, the May Day presentation of Romberg's "Student Prince."

Selections for this year are "Winterset," "The Merchant of Venice," freshman one act plays "The Exchange," "The Only Man on the Jury," and "Riders to the Sea," December 10; "The Bat," February 28; "Student Prince," May 1 and 2; and "The Heiress," May 29 and 30.
