"Harmony Night" activities will be held in Cowan Hall immediately following fraternity and sorority meetings, March 26.

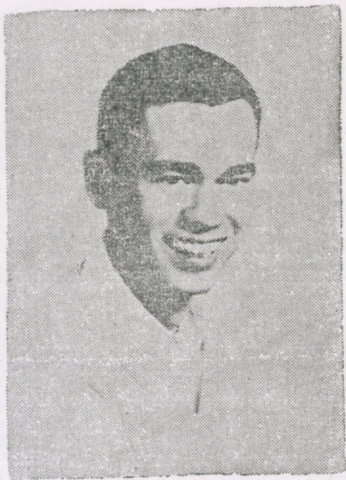
Entries should be turned in to Shirley Roe by Thursday, March 15. Information must include names of those in each quartet and the titles of their selections.
