## Useful Information

Honors & Distinction papers are **open access or closed Otterbein only** in the Otterbein's institutional repository, Digitalcommons@Otterbein, upon approval by the faculty advisor or by the Honors or Distinction committee. In limited circumstances, students may want to postpone public access to their paper. Such a postponement is known as an embargo.

Faculty and students will have the option of imposing an embargo or delay on the student's publication for the following time periods: 1 year, 3-year, 5 year or 10 years. After that time passes, the PDF will become fully accessible and available for download. This addresses situations such as patent application, book contract negotiation, or other proprietary interests that are of concern.

**Open Access** – the document and abstract become fully searchable via Institutional repository databases, Otterbein's OneSearch, and via the internet through search engines like Google.

**Embargo/Open Access** – When the Upload Authorization Form indicates that there is to be an open-access embargo applied to a particular document, the title and abstract of the document will be fully available to the public for viewing, serving as proof that the thesis was completed and defended, but the thesis is not available to view until the embargo has ended. **But the full text of the PDF document will be hidden for the indicated period. Advanced access to embargoed projects is available to Otterbein community members upon request. Otterbein students, faculty, and staff may email digitalcommons07@otterbein.edu to request access - please include the title, author, and year of the project being requested along with your name, Otterbein affiliation, and email address.**

**Closed, Otterbein Only (Title and Abstract are Public Access)**– When the option is chosen, the abstract and title of the document will be fully available to the public for viewing, serving as proof that the thesis was completed and defended, but the full text of the thesis is not available to view unless the user has an otterbein email account. Otterbein students, faculty, and staff may use their Otterbein email to set up an account with Digital Commons @ Otterbein to download the full text.

All students must perform an accessibility check in Microsoft Word **or PowerPoint** before converting their documents to PDF.
