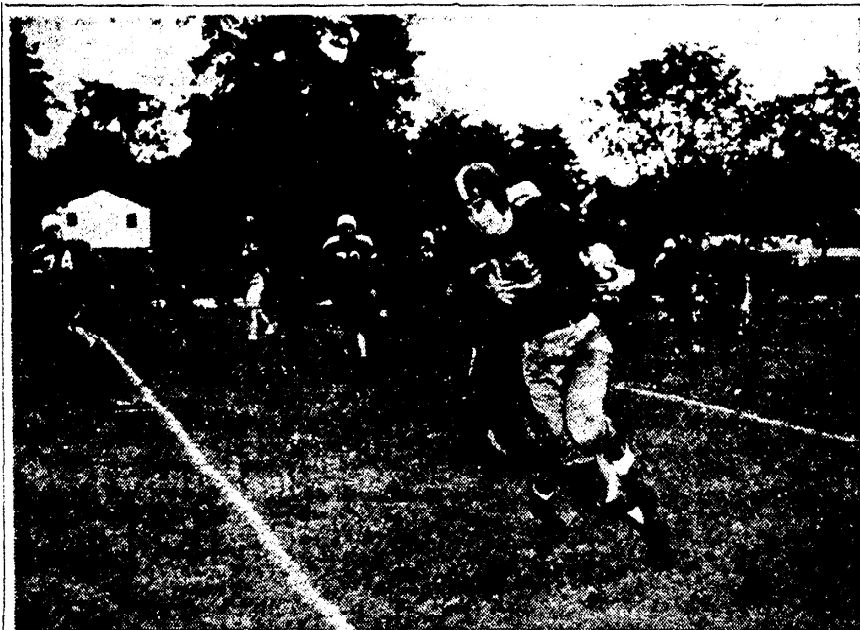


# PS AT 40 AS IT WHACKS PITT

## DETAIL OF OHIO-SOUTHERN CAL GAME

### FIRST PERIOD

Southern California won the toss and chose to kick. Ohio State to defend the north goal, the wind was from the north.

**OHIO STATE'S BALL**  
Hamilton kicked off to Clark on the Ohio 12 and he returned 24 to the 36. Clark made one at tackle and Whisler went over left guard for four. Clark tried off tackle for three and Perini punted out of bounds on the USC 37, a 19 yard kick.

**SOUTHERN CAL'S BALL**  
Bets gained two at guard, but Southern Cal's backfield was in motion and the Trojans were penalized five to their own 33. Battle fumbled and Derser recovered for Ohio on the USC 38.

**OHIO STATE'S BALL**  
Clark cut back inside and for nine. Whisler bucked for a first down on the Trojan 28. Clark lost a yard and Dummel lost three. Watson grabbed Savie's pass for 18 yards and first down on the USC 12. Clark cut back over tackle for five. Clark went over center for four. Whisler bucked for first down on the one-yard line. Whisler over a line pile-up for a touchdown. Time: Seven minutes. Widdecks kicked the point. Score—Ohio State 7; Southern Cal. 0.

**SOUTHERN CAL'S BALL**  
Trautwein kicked off to Doll on the USC eight and he returned 10 to the 18 where DiPiero hit him very hard. Doll gained one, Ohio declining an offside penalty. Powers' pass to Doll was too high. Southern Cal was offside, but Ohio declined the penalty and Battle failed to gain. Hamilton punted to

**SOUTHERN CAL'S BALL**  
Dawson kicked off to Roundy on the USC 22 and he returned 12 to the 34. Kirby found a big hole over Ohio's tackle for 7. Roundy bumped at center for 3 and a first down on the 44. Powers passed to Roundy for 13, but Southern Cal was offside and penalized 5 to its own 38. Powers passed to Kirby, who took the ball on a backward stab and went out of bounds on the Ohio 39, a 23-yard gain and first down. Burke punned for 2. Powers picked up Roundy's fumble and he gained 3. However, Southern Cal was offside and penalized 5 to Ohio's 42. Powers' pass to Tolmon was good for 16 yards and first down on the Bucks 26. Kirby lost a yard wide. Kirby went over middle for 4. Kirby got 10 through the middle, but USC was offside and penalized 5 to the Ohio 28. Murphy's pass to Jessup gained 6. Murphy failed to gain and Ohio took over on its own 22.

again to the Ohio 44.

### SOUTHERN CAL'S BALL
