Otters Plot to Stack Spiegelberg

Big Bob Agler, Otterbein's talented gridmaster, describes the Cardinals' get-ready program for this week's Ohio Conference assignment against unbeaten Oberlin simply as "Spiegelberg."

It's no code word for defensive alignments, shifts, or what have you.

Like Agler says, it merely means the Cards have one big job to do and that is corral Alan Spiegelberg, the 5-9, 185-pound Oberlin fullback, who does everything exceedingly well on the gridiron.

THE versatile junior from Oberlin High has been the big noise in the Yeomen's two victories over Hiram and Carnegie Tech. What's more he is tied with Akron's George Deo, another line-lacing fullback, for conference-scoring honors with 42 points. He's

gained 259 yards in 42 carries.

"We certainly think he is one fine back," Agler said Tuesday as he began the week's intensive workouts for his thrice-winning Otters.

"Spiegelberg does everything very well. He's built low to the ground which adds to his effectiveness as a runner. What we have seen and know about Spiegelberg, I'd have to say without reservation, he's one of the better backs in the conference."

ABOUT his own squad, Agler was pleased that the Otters came out of the Ken-

yon frolic without major injury.

"Against Findlay in the opener our passing game was sharp. Our running game held up in beating Heidelberg and last week we were forced to pass because of the defense we faced.

"Now this week we're going to concentrate mainly on defense and our ground game. We'll have our hands full with Oberlin. It is an experienced team with a lot of balance."

The Otterbein-Oberlin game is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Saturday. That is 30 minutes

earlier than usual starting time, but was set to accommodate the long-traveling visitors who still are on daylight time.
