

Otterbein Whips Mount Union 6-0

Otterbein center Charley Coffman intercepted a pitch-out in the Mt. Union backfield and raced 80 yards to score the host Cardinals' only points in toppling the Purple Raiders Saturday, 6-0.

The win gives the Otters a 2-0 Ohio Conference record, which matches Capital and keeps the Cardinals close behind front-running Denison, 3-0.

Mt. Union lost a chance to score in the opening period when Don Mohny fumbled the ball in the Otterbein end zone and Bill Heatz pounced on it for the Cardinals.

Fumblitis, which cost the Raiders possession on three of four occasions, also stopped another thrust short in the first period on the Otterbein 23.

The Cardinals threatened twice in the second period, but lost the pigskin on downs and a fumble inside the Mount 20-yard line.

Dale Ott, Otter place-kicker, missed on a field goal attempt from the 19 with seven minutes left in the contest.

Mt. Union had just recov-

ered an Otterbein fumble two plays before the touchdown run by Coffman. The Raiders then drove to the Otter one, but lost the ball on downs.
