# Four New Records In OC Grid Book

Craig Gifford, Otterbein College publicity chief, didn't bargain for a record wrecking football campaign when he assumed the duties of director of the Ohio Conference Sports Bureau.

Already four new standards have been entered in the OC grid record manual. First was the 93-yard touchdown pass play Otterbein uncorked against Kenyon. Previous record was a 91-yard play by Ohio Wesleyan in 1949.

WITTENBERG has gone into the books three times in the past two weeks. The Tigers established a new mark for the most first downs by passing with 16 against Capital. Wittenberg held the old record of 13 since 1959, but it had been tied by Capital and Otterbein already this season.

In Wittenberg's 48-0 win over Heidelberg two weeks ago, Tiger Quarterback Charlie Green put himself in the book with most yards passing, 411, and most total yards, 406. Tom Phillips, former Baldwin-Wallace star,

held the passing record with 330 yards, set in 1948, and Marietta's Dallas Gerber set the total offense mark in 1959 with 373.
