

Ealey, seventh among the passing and rushing yards as

Otters Jolted By Denison

GRANVILLE, Ohio — Bill Harris, 195-pound sophomore fullback from Columbus Marion Franklin, ran for 91 yards in Denison's 35-0 Ohio Conference victory over Otterbein Saturday and became the second Big Red player in history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a single season.

Harris' effort in 22 carries against the Cardinals pushed his total to 1,003 for the season. Last year Ed Exler set a Denison record with

1,042 yards. Harris could surpass that total in the Big Red's final game here next Saturday against Ohio Wesleyan.

DENISON, running its conference record to 4-2 and overall mark to 5-3, rolled up a total of 344 yards rushing and passing while the Big Red defense completely contained the visiting Cardinals, yielding only 23 yards on the ground and 122 overhead.

The defeat dropped Otterbein to 2-3 in the conference and 3-5 for the season.

Otterbein mounted only one serious threat when Jim Albright ran a punt return back to the Denison 30 yard line in the third period. Two running plays carried to the 18 but Denison's Steve Smiljanich made his second interception to turn back the challenge.

Trevor Young scored two of the Big Red's five touchdowns on runs of one and 46 yards. Other Denison scores were by Steve Bailey, Harold Hanley and Harris. Bailey kicked three extra points.
