WOLFARTH SETS MARK

Marietta Dumps Otterbein, 14-0

Marietta, flying high on the Terry Heaton-to-Bob Wolfarth aerial battery, spoiled Otterbein's homecoming Saturday when the Pioneers registered a surprising, 10-0 victory.

Wolfarth, an end, scored twice on passes and set an Ohio Conference record of 80 pass receptions as the visiting Pioneers handed Otterbein its second defeat of the season.

Marietta went ahead in the opening period, when Wolfarth snared a five-yard pass from quarterback Heaton to score. Wolfarth added the extra point, his first of two.

OTTERBEIN lost a scoring chance in the final minute of the first half when Bill Thompson fumbled on the five-yard line and Marietta's Bob Anderson recovered.

While Marietta and Otterbein, two of the most potent passing teams in the loop, were expected to put on a tremendous offensive display the game resolved itself into a defensive struggle. The Pioneer barriers held Otterbein to 97 yards on the ground and 73 through the air. Marietta didn't move with too much authority, stacking 138 yards rushing and 64 passing.

Wolfarth's record erased the old standard of 76 career receptions set last season by Hal Funke, also of Marietta.

The defeat set Otterbein's season record at 3-2-1 while Marietta squared its work sheet at 3-3.
