

Otterbein Is 19-7 Winner Over Marietta

Freshman Halfback Dale

Walterhouse, who hails from Upper Sandusky, stepped right into the shoes vacated by Otterbein's Dave Woods last week and paced the Cardinals to a 19-7 homecoming victory over Marietta at Westerville Saturday.

Walterhouse, a third-string halfback, entered the game in the second period and wasted no time being sensational. On his first carry from scrimmage the 176-pound halfback galloped 79 yards for a score.

Otterbein scored in the first period when Worthington's Pete Fields plunged over from the 2. Fields' score was set up four plays earlier by Larry Lintner, Gahanna grad, who recovered a fumble on the Pioneers' 21.

The Cardinals' second TD was the 79-yard "razzle-dazzle" play by Walterhouse in the second period. In the third period Walterhouse continued on his merry way and went off tackle for 24 yards and another score with 6 minutes to go. Lineman Wes Belcher ran the extra point for Otterbein.

The Marietta score came late in the final period on a plunge by Joe Scarmack. Scarmack ran the extra point. Scarmack's score was set up on a pass interception by Jim Ballentine. Ballentine grabbed a Cardinal aerial on his own 40 and returned it to the Otterbein 35. The Marietta score was their first of the season.

The game belonged to Walterhouse for three periods. The fleet-footed scatback was not only a terrific offensive threat, but his fine defensive play stopped several passes and long runs.

Otterbein gained 188 yards on the ground, as compared to Marietta's 80. The Pioneers led in first downs, 11-7.

The victory was the third in five starts for Otterbein and Marietta's fourth consecutive loss.

CARD TRICKS—Just after Queen Nancy Wood and her court had been presented to the Otterbein fans, the rains came. The Queen and her court were forced to leave the special platform built for them and watched the first half in private cars. . . . The Otterbein AFROTC marched in review to the Queen and her court at special halftime ceremonies. . . . His is slated for another X-ray Monday and if it shows nothing Wade will be back in action against Hiram. . . . Otterbein's Ed Axline and Ned Forman spent most of the time on the bench Saturday because of injuries. . . . Dick Pfeiffer, Gahanna mentor, and Otterbein grad handled the PA system for the game.
