

# Ohio Teams in Full Swing

Toledo and Miami go searching for third victories and five other teams get into action for the first time Saturday on a full 26-game card involving all of Ohio's 33 football playing colleges.

Capital and Otterbein, Franklin County's two Ohio Conference representatives, will be in action on the home front in a pair of non-conference games. Capital hosts Ohio Northern at 2 p.m. in Bernlohr Stadium and the Otters take on Ashland at 8 p.m. in Memorial Stadium, Westerville.

It's the season opener for Ohio Northern. Ashland beat Capital, 20-7, and Otterbein slipped past Kenyon, 15-14, at Gambier last week.

**CENTRAL STATE, Wil-**

lington, Wooster and Hiram get their initial 1971 tests Saturday. Central State is at Youngstown State, and Wilmington hosts Earlham under the lights, while Albion is at Wooster, and Hiram at Oberlin in two afternoon games.

Toledo's Rockets, who escaped Vallanova, 10-7, on a last-second field goal last week, seek their 26th consecutive victory in a night game at University of Texas-Arlington. Their hosts have lost 12 straight, including two this season.

The Miami U. Redskins, victorious over Pacific and Xavier, are at Dayton for their third consecutive night game. The Flyers, who have

beaten the Redskins only once in the last 11 games, opened with a victory over Cincinnati and lost to Southern Illinois last week.

**THE ONLY** Mid-American Conference game will be carried on WTVN-TV (Channel 6) in Columbus. It sends Kent State to Athens for a 1:50 p.m. meeting with Ohio University's Bobcats, who dropped a 20-19 MAC decision to Bowling Green last week. It's the Mid-Am opener for the 1-1 Flashes.

East Carolina visits Bowling Green, and Northern Illinois is at Western Michigan in two other non-conference games on the MAC slate.

There is also only one league game on the Ohio

Conference schedule, an 8 p.m. meeting in New Concord between Marietta and Muskingum.

Ohio Wesleyan hosts DePauw, and California (Pa.) State is at Wittenberg in two 1:30 p.m. games involving OC clubs. Hobart tests Kenyon at 2 p.m. in Gambier.

**BLUFFTON** which snapped a 20-game losing streak with a 23-7 victory over Taylor last week, hosts Adrian, Mich., under the lights in a game that counts in the Hoosier-Buckeye Conference standings. The other HBC games include Waynesburg at Findlay (night), Manchester at Anderson, and the Earlham-Wilmington get-together.
