# Grads Watch Cap-Kenyon

That noise you hear along the Ohio college football front heralds the arrival of the advance guard of old grads for homecoming weekend. Main echelons will reach their objective about kickoff time Saturday.

Down at Athens, Bill Hess hopes to stage a chicken pluckin' party for Ohio University Alumni. The Bobcat gridders meet the unbeaten Delaware Blue Hens, defending Middle Atlantic Conference champions and currently the No. 1 small college team in the East.

Five of the six contests in the Ohio Conference will be homecoming affairs. In the lone local attraction, Capital's Crusaders perform for the alumni against Kenyon. Kickoff is 2 p.m.

Wittenberg and Marietta the one-two passing teams in the conference, clash at

Springfield in the Tiger homecoming tilt. In this one the league's leading bombardiers, Charlie Green of Wittenberg and Marietta's Terry Heaton, match talented arms.

**BARRY JUTT**, former Pleasant View High School performer, who was a standout in Marietta's victory over Hiram last week, will be a starting tackle for the Pioneers.

Denison, the conference leader (2-0), provides Mt. Union with its homecoming attraction. The unbeaten Big Red, winner of four straight, bids for its 11th consecutive victory over a two-season span.

Otterbein, upset last week by Oberlin, faces a tough task at Hiram, where the Terriers will be celebrating homecoming. The Otters have a long injury list which could further complicate their chore.

Akron (3-1), which boasts

the conference's leading defense (137 yards average for four games), meets long time rival, Wooster, in the Scots' homecoming.

Muskingum, which has a new quarterback in Gary Pelphrey, 6-2 freshman from West Jefferson, expects 6000 for its homecoming tilt against Heidelberg at New Concord. Pelphrey passed his way to a first team berth in last Saturday's 31-0 Muskie win over Mt. Union.

Ohio Wesleyan rounds out the OC schedule at Oberlin. Baldwin-Wallace entertains Hillsdale, Mich., in the only non-conference tussle.

**AT CAPITAL**, where injuries have transformed the "swingin' sophs" into the "fight for life frosh," the Crusaders host winless but improving Kenyon, whose quarterback, Mike Wood, is one of the conference's leading passers. Six Cap starters will not suit up and a number of other regulars may be limited by severe bumps and bruises.

In the Mid-American Conference, undefeated Bowling Green continues its quest of an unprecedented third straight MAC crown against visiting Toledo. Kent State goes to Western Michigan, where a victory will be the first for either team. Miami's

Redskins have a war party at Northwestern and Marshall meets Kentucky State at Huntington, W. Va.

Ohio Northern, the state's winningest team with a 5-0 record, takes on John Carroll, 2-0, at Ada in a battle of unbeaten. The 42nd renewal of the Xavier-Dayton rivalry, with the Ohio Governor's Cup as the prize, is set for Dayton Saturday night.

**THE Delaware-Ohio University clash (2 p.m.)** rates top billing on the Buckeye grid marquee. The Blue Hens of Dave Nelson's famed Winged-T offense have gobbled up their three foes to date, Lehigh (30-0), Gettysburg (64-18) and Lafayette (61-0). The victories shot Delaware to the top of the conference and made the Hens the nation's highest scoring college team.

Big gun in the Delaware offensive arsenal is Senior Halfback Mike (The Man) Brown, a 6-0, 201 sprinter, who has picked up 306 yards in 33 carries for a 9.3 average. He was the club's rushing leader in 1961 and 1962. Quarterback Chuck Zolak has completed 12 of 20 passes for 273 yards, and four touchdowns, one covering 79 yards. He has also hurled three for

three on two-point conversion attempts.

Standout on the fast and mobile Delaware line is Capt. Paul Chesmore, a 6-2, 220-pound tackle who earned second-team Little All-American selection last season.

The 40-man Delaware squad was to arrive in Columbus late Friday afternoon by chartered aircraft and continue by bus to Athens.
