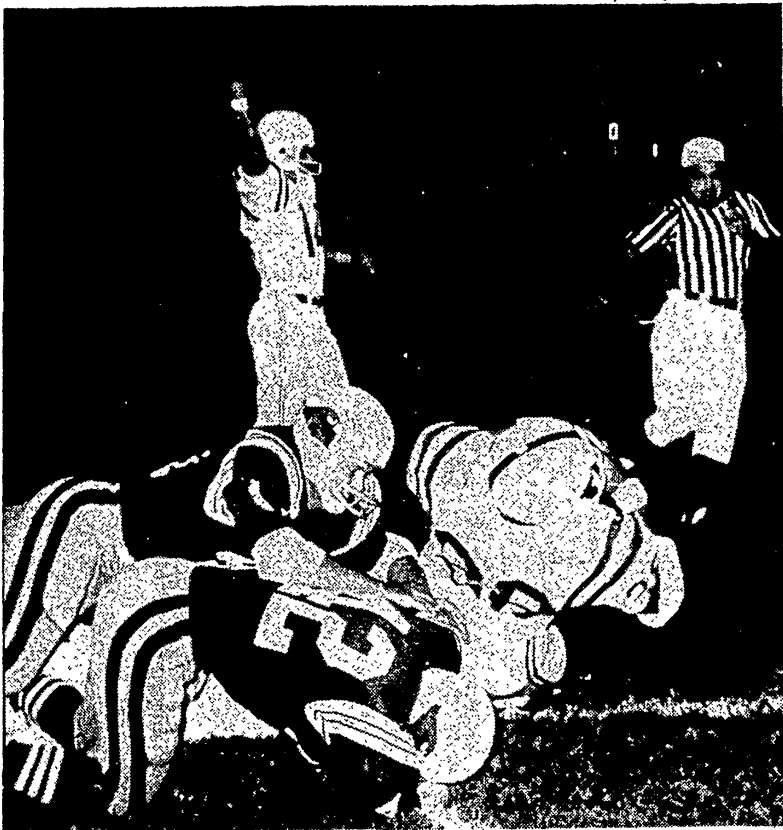

Kenyon Whips Otters In Conference Opener

Senior tailback Roland Parson carried 24 times for 166 yards and four touchdowns Saturday night to help lead visiting Kenyon College to a convincing 41-17 victory over Otterbein in a season-opening football game between the two Ohio Conference rivals.

Split end Chris Myers, the Lords' bonafide Little All-American candidate, caught eight of teammate Bill Christen's aeriels for an even 100 yards. Included was a 22-yard touchdown reception with 10 seconds left in the first half that projected Kenyon into a 21-10 advantage at the break.

THE LOSS marred Otterbein Coach Bob (Moe) Agler's return to the sidelines after a brief four-year retirement and may also have cost the Otters the services of quarterback Norm Lukey for next

week's game at Ashland College.

Lukey suffered a slight rib separation on his right side near the end of the first half and had to call it quits for the night. Inexperienced sophomore Greg Miller and Walnut Ridge freshman Jim Bontadelli were pressed into service as a result.

KENYON MOVED out to a 27-10 lead with 8:13 remaining in the third period, requiring only six plays to cover 48 yards following an Otterbein punt. Parson got the TD on a two-yard plunge after setting it up with a 17-yard jaunt on the previous play.

A five-yard pass from Bontadelli to Steve Traylor climaxed a 13-play, 61-yard drive with 2:31 left in the same period that produced the Otters' second TD and
