Kenyon Invasion Prelude To Cap's Roughest Customers

Something akin to the old wheeze of the condemned man enjoying a hearty meal, Capital University's Lutheran gridders might well make the best of their Saturday afternoon affair with Kenyon College in Bernlohr Stadium.

Simply because it appears to be the last bit of breathing space on the schedule which calls for the Capsters to brace for invasions from Wittenberg and Wooster on successive Saturdays and journeys to Marietta and Otterbein.

Coach Gene Slaughter certainly is not taking the Lords in stride. He expects a rugged go despite Kenyon's 1-2 record and two successive shellackings in Ohio Conference play.

Slaughter has not let up on his drills this week as he pushes his squad toward a victory which would run the season mark at 2-1-1. Kick-off is 2 p.m.

UNBEATEN Bowling Green, where it appears that Doyt Perry has once again razor sharp talons on his Falcons, will be home to Toledo in the Mid-American Conference feature. It's homecoming for the Perry-men.

The BeeGee defense, which has not budged for a point in MAC play and only 11 for the season, will get the big test from the Rockets' Frank Baker, who has carried 45 time for 201 yards, best in the conference.

Minus the services of their fine quarterback, Jim Flynn, Kent State goes to Marshall and should ride herd over the Herd in Huntington. In non-loop frays, Ohio University is host to Xavier for home coming and Miami plays at Purdue.
