# Perry's B-G Club Rolling

Coach Doyt Perry's Bowling Green football team is rolling and that spells trouble for Mid-American Conference rivals.

The Falcons scored their third straight triumph Saturday in impressive fashion, blanking Dayton, 28-0.

Bowling Green, which earlier turned back Detroit and Southern Illinois, opens its Mid-American schedule this week in a home encounter against Western Michigan.

The Beegees will be shooting for a third straight title and appear solid enough to rule the favorite. Perry's tough defensive line limited Dayton to 92 yards. The victory was the 200th for the school in its 45 years of competition.

In other top games Saturday, Ohio State scored its second straight success and second consecutive shutout, 21-0 over tough Indiana; Ohio University took a temporary hold on the MAC top spot with a 20-0 whitewashing of Kent State, and Miami finally broke into the victory column by edging Western Michigan 27-19.

Capt. Jim Albert scored

End Ray Leffler. It was the longest TD pass connection in Ohio Conference history.

RON PAXSON threw three touchdown passes in a losing cause as Capital bowed to Baldwin-Wallace 41-25; and Mount Union nipped Wooster 10-7 as halfback Joe Ferrante returned a kickoff 91 yards for the loser's only tally.

Miami scored in every quarter at Kalamazoo as Tom Longworth led the way with two touchdowns.

IN ANOTHER M-A contest, Marshall capitalized on a Toledo fumble with only 90 seconds left to gain a 19-18 verdict. Hard-luck Toledo now has three straight losses although outscored only 59-51.

There were plenty of thrills and individual standouts in the 15-member Ohio Conference. Wittenberg trounced Heidelberg 48-0 behind the five-touchdown performance of quarterback Charlie Green. End Bob Cherry was on the receiving end of three of the pitches.

Fullback John Lahoski scored on touchdown runs of 8 and 41 yards as Akron overpowered Ohio Wesleyan 36-7; Jack Wilson's extra point boot gave Denison a 7-6 thriller over Muskingum; Otterbein's 42-2 romp over Kenyon was featured by a 93-yard pass play from Otter Quarterback Dave Kull to
