

Unbeaten Otters Await Cap Visit

the second quarter at Manchester) and Basha (who hasn't played yet) are unable to make it Saturday night, the Otters will start three freshmen along the offensive line.

They are left tackle Kevin Lynch, right guard Joe Corbett and tight end Bob Bardeang.

"We can't look back, it's more important what happens now," says Cap's Slaughter.

He expects a typical Cap-Otter skirmish Saturday night and is well aware the Cardinals' are unbeaten, untied and unscored upon.

"It'll be a real donnybrook," predicts Gene. "They have carried over their momentum from the end of last season and seem to be putting things together."

"I don't care who you play, when you hold the other team scoreless, you have to be pretty good."

After viewing the films, Slaughter decided it was faulty execution rather than missed assignments that caused the breakdown against Marietta.

"WE GOT TO the assignment, but then didn't execute. We call that miss-manned," said Slaughter.

Cap, shooting for its 12th consecutive victory over the Otters, should be in good shape physically. The big Crusader problem at the moment would appear to be mental.

Otterbein's only victory in 14 tries against Slaughter-coached Cap teams was by a 21-6 margin in 1963 at Westerville.

Cap also enjoys a 27-20-1 series edge. The only tie was an 18-18 deadlock in 1958 at Capital. The two teams have met annually since 1927 except for 1943, when Cap did not field a team.
