# Otterbein Faces Bishops Saturday

Harry Ewing, who has been coaching college football for more years than he cares to admit, has a squad of 38 boys working out daily at Otterbein, in Westerville.

First problem is to get the boys into condition for Saturday's opener against Ohio Wesleyan, at 1:30 p. m. in Delaware.

"That'll be a rugged game," Ewing spoke up. "Wesleyan is always tough for us. Then you look at last year's record and see that Wesleyan lost its first game, then won eight in a row."

"We're green, we're small, we're young."

"But by gosh, they're willing. They'll work their heads off."

"We lost a lot by graduation, and we lost some to the armed services. Off of last year's team we have lost the offensive line, and off the defense we've lost a guard, three tackles, an end, and four backs."

"Then on top of that Chuck Ferguson came down with a liver ailment this summer and he won't be able to play at all. Fact is, I doubt if he's even ready when the basketball season comes around," Ewing lamented.

Ferguson is the Plain City lad who never played football until his junior year in college, and

turned out to be a fine quarterback.

Otterbein's athletic record has been one that belies its size. The college in Westerville has an enrollment of approximately 600, of which more than half are women. That leaves something like 275 men, which isn't much compared to some other schools in the Ohio Conference.

Ewing couldn't be enticed into naming a lineup which might start against Wesleyan Saturday. "How can I?" he asked. "We don't know. We make changes every day trying to find the team that's going to click—and I'm still not done trying to find tackles."

"I think everybody on the squad will have had a turn playing tackle before we're ready. You can't play football without tackles, and I'm still looking for some," Ewing moaned.

## Previous Semester Rule Is Changed For Servicemen

Ohio High Schools will be allowed to use students on their athletic squads who have returned from service with the National Guard, Naval Reserves or any other such service groups starting Wednesday.
