Cards Click On Late Rally

HIRAM, Ohio — Otterbein went into the last quarter tied with Hiram Saturday at 12-12, and came out with a 26-18 Ohio Conference victory on Dick Reynolds' 55-yard punt return score and fullback Bill Thompson's second touchdown of the game.

Thompson's one-yard plunge was the only score in the first half, and Hiram tied it early in the third quarter on Harvey Gelsand's one-yard run. A 66-yard pass to Dick Amelung from Dave Kull put the Otters ahead, but the Terriers knotted it again on a 50-yard pass from John Ferrara to Tom Reuschling near the end of the third quarter.

Reuschling caught another touchdown pass from Ferrara, a 15-yarder, for the last score of the afternoon.

GARY REYNOLDS kicked extra points after Otterbein's pair of last-quarter scores.

Bill Thompson was Otterbein's chief ground gainer with 73 yards in 16 carries. Tackle Jim Wacker was the outstanding Cardinal defensive performer. The win boosted Otterbein's season record to 3-1-1 while Hiram is 1-3.

Green Hurls Three TDs In 57-7 Win

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio (AP)—Chuck Green threw three touchdown passes as Wittenberg scored in every quarter to bury Marietta 57-7 in an Ohio Conference football game.

Wittenberg's senior end Bob Cherry set an OC career record by catching his 22nd touchdown pass in the first quarter.

Other Tiger heroes included Larry Skeldon and Bob Harvey, who both scored twice, and Jim Render, who scored once, threw one TD pass and kicked six extra points.

Wittenberg ran up 576 yards on offense shattering a school mark set in 1953 against these same Pioneers when the Tigers chalked up 551 yards. The Tigers are now 4-0-1 in conference play.
