Second Half Rally Brings Victory to Otterbein, 13-6

WESTERVILLE, OHIO, OCT. 19.—In a cold, drizzling rain, Otterbein came from behind in the second half to defeat Bluffton 13 to 6 in its final home game of the season.

Mel Yoder, Bluffton halfback, grabbed an Otterbein fumble in the second quarter and raced 90 yards along the side line for a touchdown, giving the Beavers an early lead.

Safety Wins For Reserve

CLEVELAND, OCT. 19. — (AP).— Western Reserve gained revenge on Baldwin-Wallace today with a first period safety for a 2 to 0 victory over the favored Yellow Jackets from neighboring Berea.

The Red Cats, who because of a safety dropped an 8 to 7 contest to Baldwin-Wallace last year, used the same weapon in the first period and clung to the slim margin through 60 minutes of muddy football before less than 3000 chilled customers.

B-W was favored, even without its ace back, high-scoring George Morris, unable to play because of a leg injury, but the Red Cats obtained the ball on their own 41 in the opening session. Halfback Dick Booth got off a long kick taken by B-W Quarterback Wayne Harrington on his five. Harrington attempted to run and was trapped and downed in his end zone by End Paul Hudson and Fullback Steve Belichick of Reserve for the only score of the game.

At the start of the third period Otterbein took the kickoff from its own 35-yard line and drove to the Bluffton five, from where Jack Wells, speedy halfback, scored on a well-executed reverse. With the score knotted at six all, Jim Eby, sophomore from Trottwood, kicked a perfect placement to put the Cards in the lead. Otterbein continued to dominate the play throughout the fourth quarter, taking the ball on its own 30, and in successive long gains by Wells, Eby and Warren Ernsberger carried it to the Beaver two-foot line. With 12 seconds remaining, Ernsberger rammed left tackle for the final score.

The Cards piled up 11 first downs, nine of which came in the second half. Bluton had two first downs.
