

Marshall Is New Leader in M-A

The Mid-American Conference had a new, unfamiliar leader. Marshall's Thundering Herd, winner of only 13 of 51 loop games up to this season, is the lone unbeaten team in the rugged circuit after being picked to finish in the second division.

Miami's resurgent Redskins changed things Saturday with a 21-12 win over Bowling Green, ending the Falcons' eight-game winning streak. Marshall made it to the top with a 2-0-1 record by trimming Western Michigan 20-7. Miami is 3-1-1, Bowling Green 3-1-0 and Ohio University 2-1-0—and both the Falcons and Bobcats get a crack at the Herd later. So does Kent State, which won its first game of the season Saturday, 20-0 over Toledo.

The top teams in the Ohio Conference faced non-loop foes. Denison tripped Western Reserve 17-0 for its 13th straight. Wittenberg nosed out Lenoir Rhyne of North Carolina 28-27 to avenge the only Tiger loss in the last 31 games.

John Carroll won its 13th in a row, 20-13, over Case Tech, and retained the Presidents' Conference top spot.

Ashland nicked Otterbein 7-6 for its first over the Cards since 1939, and Kenyon's Mike Wood threw three touchdown passes as Kenyon whipped Mount Union for the first time in 20 tries 34-22. Xavier limited Ohio University to 22 yards rushing as the Musketeers triumphed 20-0.

Ohio teams won seven and lost six against out-of-state opponents, and now have a record of 45 victories, 37 losses and a scoring edge of 1524 to 1287 in interstate play.
