DiBlasi Sets Mount Win Over Otters

Halfback Mike DiBlasi, bidding for his second consecutive Ohio Conference scoring championship, scored three touchdowns Saturday night as visiting Mt. Union raced to a 40-19 victory over winless Otterbein.

DiBlasi scored on runs of three and one yards and gathered in a 27-yard TD aerial from Larry Kehres as the Purple Raiders won for the third time in four starts and squared their OC record at 1-1. Three of Otterbein's four losses have been in conference play.

QUARTERBACK Bill Ungar hit split end Bruce Cartwright with a touchdown pass that covered 46 yards to break the game's only tie as Mt. Union went up 13-7 with 9:30 left in the first half.

The Purple Raiders went up 20-7 later in the second period when Joe Salpietra's

one-yard plunge capped a 60-yard drive. Other quarterback Norm Lukey teamed with wide receiver Steve Traylor on a six-yard TD pass to close it to 20-13 Mt. Union prior to the halftime break.

BUT RANDY Berry's 39-yard touchdown jaunt in the third period gave the visitors a 27-13 advantage. DiBlasi's two fourth-period TD's preceded a Gary Kuzyk-to-Pete Parker touchdown pass in the final three minutes that wrapped up the scoring.

Despite the loss, Lukey enjoyed his best night of the season. The Otter QB connected on 25 of 40 passing attempts for 322 yards and had only one intercepted.
